Did You Know? Good Friday

On this and the following day, by a most ancient tradition, the Church does not celebrate the Sacraments at all, except for Penance and the Anointing of the Sick. On this day, Holy Communion is distributed to the faithful only within the celebration of the Lord's Passion or brought to the sick who cannot participate in this celebration.

The celebration of our Lord's Passion consists of 3 parts: the Liturgy of the Word, the Adoration of the Cross, and Holy Communion. There is no sign of the cross or greeting at the beginning (nor is there one at the end of the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday) because it is a continuation of the same celebration from Holy Thursday through to the Easter Vigil.

As part of the Liturgy of the Word, the Solemn Intercessions are said or sung. We pray for the Holy Church, the Pope, all orders and degrees of the faithful, catechumens, the unity of Christians, the Jewish people, those who do not believe in Christ or God, those in public office, and those in tribulation. The tradition of praying for all these intentions is at least from as early as the 8^{th} century.

After the Solemn Intercessions, the Veneration of the Cross takes place. There should only be one cross for the people to venerate. This year, individual veneration of the Cross is permitted as was the custom prior to the beginning of the pandemic. However, please refrain from kissing the Cross, and instead adore by a simple touch, bowing, or genuflecting.

Following the Veneration of the Cross, the distribution of Holy Communion takes place. Hosts consecrated at the Mass of the Lord's Supper are distributed. The Good Friday service is not a Mass because we remember the reality of Jesus' Passion through the Gospel and Veneration of the Cross, without celebrating the "representation" or the memorial of his passion through the Mass. Also, the omission of the prayer of consecration deepens our sense of loss and sorrow because Mass throughout the year reminds us of the Lord's triumph over death, but the desolate quality of the rites of this day reminds us of Christ's humiliation and suffering during his Passion.

Covid Protocol Update

Beginning this past Monday, March 21, in accordance with the Provincial guidelines and regulations, face masks are no longer required in any churches, parish offices, meeting spaces and parish halls in the Diocese of Hamilton. While they are no longer required, we continue to respect those who choose to wear masks because of personal choice. We are also permitted to resume many other parish ministries and activities, but we just ask for your patience as we get things going as soon as we are able to.

Chrism Mass

The Chrism Mass will be held at the Cathedral of Christ the King on Monday, April 11, 2022, at 2:00 pm. The last couple years, the Chrism Mass was not open to the public because of the pandemic, but we are glad that this year's celebration is open to all the faithful of the diocese to attend. No reservation or registration is necessary. The Chrism Mass is where the Sacred Chrism, the Oil of the Sick, and the Oil of Catechumens are blessed by the Bishop for the use in all the parishes throughout the year. This Chrism Mass is also where all the priests of the diocese gather and renew our commitment and promises as priests of the diocese. "This Mass, which the Bishop concelebrates with his presbyterate, should be, as it were, a manifestation of the Priests' communion with their Bishop." (Roman Missal) Traditionally, this Mass is held on Holy Thursday, but because of parish schedules and the distance many priests travel to attend, it is usually celebrated on the Monday of Holy Week in our diocese. If you cannot attend, please pray for all the priests on that day.

Forward Together in Christ An excerpt from our Auxiliary Bishop

As we all have experienced, the past two years have taken a great toll on us. We are all exhausted and feel beaten down. As the COVID restrictions begin to lift and we look at the mammoth task ahead of re-opening our Parishes and our Diocese, the task can seem daunting. Each group and ministry needs new volunteers and training. What ministries do we re-start first? Which do we leave left un-started? How do we begin again to celebrate the Sacred Liturgy according to the mind of the Church?...

To assist with this, we are developing a process, which we are calling: "Forward Together in Christ." The first step will involve initial engagement with Diocesan groups such as Clergy, Permanent Deacons and Parish Pastoral Staff on what they would like to see reflected in the moving forward strategy and ideas for the next steps. Once developed, the plan will serve as a roadmap for how the Diocese of Hamilton approaches the next 3 to 5 years. The strategy will include clear goals, objectives, and actions aligned with our Catholic values and our diocesan mission and vision.
