Did You Know #9

Following the Gloria, the priest says "Let us pray", and then pauses. This is the moment of Sacred Silence when everyone calls to mind what they want to offer the Mass for, or who they want to pray for, or what intentions they have in their hearts. We all come to the Mass and participate in the offering in our own way, so we take a moment to call to mind what we are bringing to the Mass today, whether it is intentions, praises, and thanksgivings.

"Sacred silence also, as part of the celebration, is to be observed at the designated times. Its nature, however, depends on the moment when it occurs in the different parts of the celebration. For in the Penitential Act and again after the invitation to pray, individuals recollect themselves; whereas after a reading or after the Homily, all meditate briefly on what they have heard; then after Communion, they praise God in their hearts and pray to him. Even before the celebration itself, it is a praiseworthy practice for silence to be observed in the church, in the sacristy, in the vesting room, and in adjacent areas, so that all may dispose themselves to carry out the sacred celebration in a devout and fitting manner." (*GIRM* 45)

Updates on Parish Upgrades

Recently we had some electrical contractors come in and provide quotes for updating the lights in the Church, hall, office, and parking lot. The plan is to retrofit the light fixtures in the church with LED bulbs. Currently the large, upper lights are 500W each, and the lower lights in the church are 200W each. The new LEDs will be 40W and 20W each and produce much more light than what is currently installed. You may see in the coming weeks one or two lights replaced so that we can see how they function and look in our church.

The office and hall will be updated with LED panels replacing the fluorescent panels, and LED "pot" lights to replace the current pot lights. The parking lot will have LED flood lights installed on the light poles. This will provide much better illumination than the old and dim lights that are currently installed. Those who come to the 8pm Mass in the winter know how dark the parking lot is at night, even with all the exterior lights on.

Finally, we had a contractor come in to start the process installing new doors at the entrance way, new flooring in the church, and some small renovations in the office area. I am glad that the projects that we have raised money for in the "One Heart One Soul" campaign are finally underway. I hope to start the most essential projects this summer and will keep you updated on progress as it continues. Fr. John

Update on Parking Lot Repainting

This **Tuesday May 24**, Technoline Pavement Services Inc. will be working in the parking lot filling in the cracks with a tar mixture. This prevents water and moisture from seeping below the asphalt and causing further cracking, craters, potholes due to thawing and freezing cycles. Sealing cracks helps to prevent larger maintenance projects down the road.

On **Monday May 30**, Tecnoline will be back to repaint the lines in the parking lot. Access to the parking lot on these two days will be restricted, and we ask for your patience as we take care of these maintenance items.
