Covid Vaccination Policy for Parish Volunteers

According to Diocesan Policy, all Lectors, Eucharistic Ministers, Ushers and Musicians should be vaccinated against Covid-19. For all the active volunteers, please show your vaccination receipt in person to Fr. John, Fr. Gregory, Deacon Brian, or Arden Ouellette. You can do this when you come to Mass, but please arrive early or wait to see one of us after Mass. Do not send your covid vaccination receipt by email. We do not need to collect your personal information.

If we do not receive your vaccination status by **October 31**, we will remove your name from the ministry list. Some volunteer lists are very outdated, so this is our way of determining who our current volunteers are. If you change your mind in the future, reach out to us at that time.

For those whose ministry is not yet active (eg. sacristans, children's liturgy, altar servers, funeral servers) we will ask for proof of vaccination (if required) when your ministry resumes.

Anyone may continue to attend Mass without showing vaccination status.

On November 1, the Feast of All Saints, the Gospel is the Beatitudes from the Sermon on the Mount. The Beatitudes are promises of a future reward for good behavior in the present. They are a good reminder to us that, as people of faith, we are not living for this world, but have our sights fixed on Heaven. Lector and Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion training dates

For all Lectors and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion (EMHC) of St. Paul's, you will be required to attend a training session led by Deacon John Moss, the director of Liturgy for the Diocese of Hamilton. This date has been set to be **Saturday**, **November 20, 2021** and will be held at St. Paul's. The Lector training will be from 10:00am to 12:30pm, and the EMHC training will be from 1:30pm to 4:00pm.

These ministries are of great importance and dignity in the liturgy, so it is necessary that all ministers are trained appropriately and regularly. These ministries are so serious that the Bishop issues mandates to those who are properly trained. Lector and EMHC mandates have a 3 year term and are renewable at the pastor's discretion. The Bishop is required to ensure that all Lectors and EMHC are properly trained; therefore, all Lectors and EMHC at St. Paul's will be expected to have a mandate to carry out these ministries. Those who attend the training session(s) on **November 20** will have mandates issued for your ministry.

If you are currently not active as a Lector or EMHC but may want to resume your ministry in the coming months, you are invited to participate in the training now so that you can partake in your ministry when you are ready.

For those who take communion in a pyx to a family member at home or to a seniors' residence, this is also a function of an EMHC; you will therefore need the proper training and mandate to continue this practice. There will be some additional items covered during the training for taking communion to the homebound.

One Heart One Soul Campaign Update

Many thanks to all our parishioners who have contributed to the One Heart One Soul Campaign. Our parish goal was \$728,000, and we currently have \$533,321 pledged including \$189,289 paid to date. We had sent out 1,039 pledge packages, and 279 were completed and returned, or 26.8%. Across the Diocese, the entire campaign goal was \$35 million, and the total pledges from across the Diocese currently is \$35,447,053. Although we came up short in our parish, we helped to meet the diocesan goal. May God bless everyone abundantly for their generosity.
