Anti-Bullying Legislation - There has been significant public dialogue regarding anti-bullying legislation currently being considered by our Members of Provincial Parliament. A number of partners from our faith community have been actively engaged in this process for many months. In January 2012, the Ontario catholic school trustees' Association (OCST), in collaboration with the Assembly of Catholic Bishops of Ontario (ACBO) released, "Respecting Difference", a guideline for dealing with issues of Equity, Inclusivity & Bullying in our Catholic schools. This template has been provided to Catholic School Boards and is in use throughout the province. You can access the document through the Archdiocese of Toronto website: www.archtoronto.org.

There are currently two bills before the Legislature on the issue of bullying: Bill 13, introduced by the current Government and Bill 14, a Private Members Bill introduced by a member of the Official Opposition. Contrary to some reports, the proposed bills do not deal with the controversial sex-ed curriculum that made headlines in 2010. While the ACBO and OCSTA agree with the objective of eradicating bullying in any form, they are currently discussing possible amendments that they feel will help clarify and strengthen the implementation of the legislation. Our approach to dealing with the difficult issue of bullying in our Catholic Schools will be centered on our faith, treating each person as a child of God, accepted with compassion, love and respect.

REFLECTIONS DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

"Today the Lord shows us his glorious wounds and his heart, an inexhaustible source of light and truth, of love and forgiveness.

The Heart of Christ! His "Sacred Heart" has given men everything: redemption, salvation, sanctification. St Faustina Kowalska saw coming from this Heart that was overflowing with generous love, two rays of light which illuminated the world. "The two rays", according to what Jesus himself told her, "represent the blood and the water" (*Diary*, p. 132). The blood recalls the sacrifice of Golgotha and the mystery of the Eucharist; the water, according to the rich symbolism of the Evangelist John, makes us think of Baptism and the Gift of the Holy Spirit (cf. Jn 3: 5; 4: 14).

Through the mystery of this wounded heart, the restorative tide of God's merciful love continues to spread over the men and women of our time. Here alone can those who long for true and lasting happiness find its secret.

"Jesus, I trust in you". This prayer, dear to so many of the devout, clearly expresses the attitude with which we too would like to abandon ourselves trustfully in your hands, O Lord, our only Saviour.

You are burning with the desire to be loved and those in tune with the sentiments of your heart learn how to build the new civilization of love. A simple act of abandonment is enough to overcome the barriers of darkness and sorrow, of doubt and desperation. The rays of your divine mercy restore hope, in a special way, to those who feel overwhelmed by the burden of sin.

Mary, Mother of Mercy, help us always to have this trust in your Son, our Redeemer. Help us too, St Faustina, whom we remember today with special affection. Fixing our weak gaze on the divine Saviour's face, we would like to repeat with you: "Jesus, I trust in you". Now and forever. Amen. "

HOMILY OF JOHN PAUL II

Sunday, 22 April 2001

Ask for His Mercy. God wants us to approach him in prayer constantly, repenting of our sins and asking Him to pour His mercy out upon us and upon the whole world.

Be Merciful. God wants us to receive His mercy and let it

flow through us to others. He wants us to extend love and forgiveness to others just as He does to us.

Completely trust. God wants us to know that the graces of His mercy are dependent upon our trust. The more we trust in Jesus, the more we will receive.
