

# Happy Father's day

Today is Father's Day, that one day of the year when we take time out to pay tribute to the most important man in our life – our Father. Fathers need to know we care, that we appreciate all they have done or are doing for us and that we'll be there for him, and he needs us to give him the same kind of support that he has so often given to us in life. May God's wondrous love be yours this Father's Day and always.

**Prayer of Fathers** - Heavenly Father, you have been pleased to let me be called by the name that is yours from all eternity. Help me to be worthy of that name. May I always be for my children a source of life – corporal, intellectual, and spiritual. Enable me to contribute in great part to their physical growth by my work, to their mental advancement by good schooling and to their supernatural life by my prayer and example, so that they may become complete human beings and true children of their heavenly Father.

Let me be conscious that my actions are far more important than my words. May I always give my children a good example in all the situations of life. May I wear my successes modestly, and may my failures find me undaunted; may I be temperate in time of joy and steadfast in time of sorrow. May I remain humble after doing good and contrite after doing evil. Above all, may I scrupulously respect my children's rights as human persons and their freedom to follow a rightly-formed conscience, while at the same time fulfilling my duty to guide them in the way given us by your Son Jesus. Be Not Afraid

"The outbreak of the war took me away from my studies and from the university. In that period I also lost my father....At the same time a light was beginning to shine ever more brightly in the back of my mind: the Lord wants me to become a priest. One day I saw this with great clarity; it was like an interior illumination which brought with it the joy and certainty of a new vocation."

These words from Pope John Paul II's memoir *Gift* and *Mystery* (p.35) describe an extraordinary reaction to a young life drenched in loss. Though he came of age in one of the most hellish times and locations of the twentieth century, John Paul II was able to greet the Catholic world in 1978 as the newly chosen pope with the words, "Be not afraid!" Almost two decades after taking on the Church's difficult final decades of this century, he was able to title one of his books *Crossing the Threshold of Hope*. John Paul's balance, sanity, and serenity through the many upheavels of his own life – and the lives of his fellow Christians –are an enduring witness to the abundant grace of God.

...A courage strong enough to be hopeful in desperate circumstances, a powerful and wideranging intellect, a confident faith unafraid to engage others in pursuit of the truth in love, a determination to defend the rights of human beings infinitely precious to God their Father – these hallmarks of John Paul II have contributed to his powerful impact and significant achievements as successor to St. Peter.

"Every time Christ exhorts us to have no fear, He has both God and man in mind. He means: *Do not be afraid of God ... Do not be afraid to say 'Father'!*" (Crossing the Threshold of Hope)"
