ETERNAL LIFE THROUGH RELATIONSHIP WITH GOD

The withering of hope in eternity is thus simply the reverse side of the withering of faith in the living God. The belief in eternal life is simply the application to our own existence of faith in God. Hence it can only come to life again if we discover a new relationship with God-if we learn to see God once more as an active agent in the world and in regard to ourselves. "We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come"—this statement is not a further demand for faith, set up beside faith in God; it is simply the unpacking of what it means to believe in God, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. It is not by analysis of our own existence, not by looking at ourselves, at our hopes and our needs, that we discover eternal life. Eternal life steadily withdraws from a person whose attention is fixed on himself. In turning toward God it becomes obvious that anyone upon whom God has looked, and whom he loves, shares in his eternity. Origen once expressed this insight quite beautifully, saying: "that every being which shares in that eternal nature itself exists forevermore...expresses the eternity of the divine loving-kindness?" He then adds: "Would it not seem godless to assume that a spirit capable of relating to God should suffer destruction in its substance?"
