WORLD MISSION SUNDAY - WHY?

The collection taken up **everywhere** in the world on this day is **given in its totality** to the support of Churches in the developing world.

The support is **universal**, not just for one mission, but for all missions.

This year the Society for the Propagation of the Faith will help support the ordinary pastoral work and pastoral projects in about 1100 dioceses or territories. Many of these are in some of the poorest countries in the world and depend heavily on our support.

Even the poorest countries take up collections to give what they can materially. More importantly, they give their prayers and a depth of spirituality that enrich all of us.

What are the principal works the collection is for?

- To train and support catechist (There are about 1.6 million mission catechists)
- To provide education through schools, colleges, universities, some seminaries
- To build rural health clinics
- > To support specific diocesan pastoral projects
- To use mass media for evangelization
- To provide emergency aid to refugees and aid to disaster areas
- To safeguard the livelihood of missionaries and local clergy
- To train local religious
- To establish new religious houses
- To open new missions and to establish new dioceses
 To assist people of poor communities to build decent
- structures for prayer and community meetings.

<u>THE MAGISTERIUM OF THE CHURCH</u> (source: *Catechism of the Catholic Church #*85-90)

"The task of giving an authentic interpretation of the Word of God, whether in its written form or in the form of Tradition, has been entrusted to the living teaching office of the Church alone. Its authority in this matter is exercised in the name of Jesus Christ" (Dei Verbum 10(2)). This means that the task of interpretation has been entrusted to the bishops in communion with the successor of Peter, the Bishop of Rome. "Yet this Magisterium is not superior to the Word of God, but is its servant. It teaches only what has been handed on to it. At the divine command and with the help of the Holy Spirit, it listens to this devotedly, guards it with dedication and expounds it faithfully. All that it proposes for belief as being divinely revealed is drawn from this single deposit of faith" (DV 10). Mindful of Christ's words to his apostles: "He who hears you, hears me" (Lk 10:16). The faithful receive with docility the teachings and directives that their pastors give them in different forms.

The Church's Magisterium exercises the authority it holds from Christ to the fullest extent when it defines dogmas, that is, when it proposes truths contained in divine Revelation or also when it proposes in a definitive way truths having a necessary connection with them. There is an organic connection between our spiritual life and the dogmas. Dogmas are lights along the path of faith; they illuminate it and make it secure. Conversely, if our life is upright, our intellect and heart will be open to welcome the light shed by the dogmas of faith (cf. Jn 8:31-32). The mutual connections between dogmas, and their coherence, can be found in the whole of the Revelation of the mystery of Christ (cf. Vatican Council I: DS 3016). "In Catholic doctrine there exists an order or hierarchy of truths, since they vary in their relation to the foundation of the Christian faith" (UR II).
