Archdiocesan Week of Prayer for Vocations – Monday, April 19-Saturday, April 24, 2021

During this week, Fr. Matt McCarthy, Director, Office of Vocations, has asked that we all take some time, as a community, to pray for vocations to the priesthood, religious and consecrated life. At this time, we also ask that you pray for our 6 soon-to-be-priests along with all those who are discrning and who are currently in formation. Confirmation: (for those who missed in 2020) Confirmation Masses wil take place this week as follows:

Mon. Apr. 19 – St. Padre Pio School at 6pm Tues. Apr. 20 – St. Stephen School at 6pm Wed. Apr. 21 – St. Stephen School at 6pm Fri. Apr. 23 – St. Stephen School at 6pm

Because of the limited capacity during the pandemic, only a small number of students at a time may take part in the Mass. This would also include 9 guests for each student, including sponsor and parents. The Mass will be vey simple – no singing (as per the Archdiocese), no lectors, no offertory procession, no robes, and no group photos (as per the Archdiocese). Everyone including the students should be wearing masks for the entire celebration. This is a very difficult time and we are trying to do our best to serve the needs of our students and their families.

Weekday Masses – On Monday and Wednesday evening of this week there will be Confirmation Masses at 6pm. The 7pm Masses will continue as usual. However, because there will not be time to sanitize the pews after the Confirmations, parishioners are asked to use the side pews for the Parish Mass.

Church Capacity at 15% - during this present shut-down, church capacity is at 15%. When the two centre sections of pews are full, that is our full capacity, and no one else may enter the church BY LAW. It is strongly recommended that you come early for a seat during this difficult time.

Stories of the Resurrection – The stories of the Resurrection are told over and over again at Easter. They are to be found at the end of the four Gospels. The Gospels of Luke and John tell the stories in much more detail than the other two. You should read these stories as they are told in the bible. They appear in the following Gospels: Matthew 28, Mark: 16, Luke: 24, and John: 20, 21. There are differences in the way the Gospel writers relate the happenings and it must be said that there is something mysterious about the stories they tell. We should remember that the disciples could not fully understand the events themselves. They were dazed and bewildered. In putting these stories down they were telling of what went on inside their heads as much as what was happening outside. One thing does seem certain. At the beginning of these incidents all the disciples were convinced that Jesus was dead. At the end, the same disciples were guite sure that He was alive and that they had seen Him.

The Resurrection stories tell the great, central truth of the faith – Christ is risen. The Resurrection came on a Sunday, which is why, right from the start; the disciples changed their Sabbath day from the Jewish Saturday in order to celebrate it. The first disciples did not find the Resurrection easy to believe at first either. They

could never fully explain it. All they could do was celebrate it. This has been the experience of countless men and women over the centuries. They have, like the disciples, become convinced that Jesus is risen and they have tried to express their feelings in music and poetry and art. They express it in festival too – in the great annual festival of Easter, when these stories are told again and again.

The Time of Easter – The first Passover is commemorated each year by members of the Jewish faith, about March 21. For many years Easter was celebrated at the same time because Jesus was crucified during Passover. In 325AD a group of bishops meeting in Nicaea, a city in what we now call Turkey, decided that Easter should be on a different day. They chose the Sunday following the first full moon after the vernal equinox. Vernal means 'spring' and equinox means 'equal night'. Thus, this is the 24-hour period in spring when both day and night last exactly 12 hours, usually on Mar 21 or 22. Full moons however, do not always come on the same date, so Easter may fall on any Sunday between March 22 and April 25. Sometimes it comes before Passover, and many Orthodox Christians wait until Passover to celebrate Easter.

<u>Easter Water</u> – In the liturgy of the Easter Vigil, the baptismal font, filled with water, is solemnly blessed. Many people take this water home in small containers to be used as holy water, to sprinkle on persons, houses and rooms during the Easter season. Some families sprinkle the food on the table with it. This marks the Easter dinner as a solemn and festive occasion upon which they ask God's blessing.
