Anniversary of Monsignor Greg's Appointment

On February 1, 2014, Monsignor Greg was appointed a Chaplain of His Holiness by Pope Francis. This title is granted by the Pope, to a member of the diocesan clergy upon the request of the local Bishop or Cardinal. The granting of the request is not automatic but is subject to the examination of the merits of the priest considered for the rank, and to the criteria of the Holy See. Once the candidate has passed all of the requirements, a rescript is drawn up by the Secretariat of the State, attesting to their promotion to this ecclesiastical rank. The appointment takes effect according to the date on the document from Rome.

Chaplains of His Holiness are prelates of the Church, styled as 'Reverend Monsignor', and in conversation are simply addressed as 'Monsignor'. The abbreviated form is Msgr. The initials C.H.H. are placed after their name. The plural of Monsignor is Monsignori. Their vesture is a black, purple-trimmed cassock, with a purple sash. Roman purple, however, is actually more reddish than true purple. It is more accurately described as amaranth red or fuchsia.

Chaplains of His Holiness may have a personal coat-of-arms and are permitted to ensign their arms with the black galero or Roman hat. Suspended on either side of these prelates' shields are six violet fiocchi or tassels, in rows of one, two and three. A motto is permitted. Chaplains of His Holiness do not have any other special duties outside their responsibilities as priests. However, as prelates of the Church, they may participate in Papal liturgies and ceremonies, wearing the robes of their office. Their names are also listed in the Annuario Pontificio, the Papal yearbook. The title is not only a personal honour conferred upon the priest, but it is also an honourary position within the Papal Household, bonding the priest to the Pope himself. It is a gift of great personal esteem from the Holy Father, and also an honour that brings recognition to the Archdiocese and the parish.
