## **MARRIAGE:**

Couples planning to be married must contact a priest **one year in advance**. They must also receive personal preparation for entering marriage.

If either party has previously gone through any form of civil or religious marriage with another person, the priest is not permitted to set a date for the wedding until the Bishop's office has been consulted.

#### Baptism of the Lord

At the beginning of His public life, Jesus was baptized by John in the Jordan: the Father proclaimed that Jesus was the beloved Son, the Spirit was poured upon Him to send Him on His mission: to free us from sin and to save the world. The Church sees our Lord's baptism as a model of our own, particularly of adults. In the blessing of baptismal water at the Easter Vigil His baptism is referred to as one of the signs of God's power at work among us. The feast of the Baptism of the Lord completes the work of the Christmas season. We have recalled God's marvelous deeds in the incarnation and birth of the saviour. We have answered His call to conversion, and are ready to continue working with Him for the glory of God and the salvation of His people. With this feast we end the Christmas season and begin Ordinary Time. On the feast of the Baptism of the Lord, it is fitting to give thanks to God for the gift of our own baptism. "Blessed are you, Lord God, ruler of all creation; You have made us your beloved children, brothers and sisters of Jesus our saviour and temples of Your Spirit. Father, we thank you for making us Christians; give us your help to continue dying to sin and to live with Christ for you. Lead all people into your Kingdom of light. All praise and glory be to you, Father, through your Son Jesus Christ, in the unity of your Holy Spirit, now and forever." Amen.

**Recipe for a Happy New Year** – Take twelve fine, full grown months; see that these are thoroughly free from old memories of bitterness, rancor and hate, cleanse them completely from every clinging spite; pick off all specks of pettiness and littleness; in short, see that these months are freed from the past – have them fresh and clean as when they first came from the great storehouse of Time. Cut these months into thirty or thirty one equal parts. Do not attempt to make up the whole batch at one time (so many persons spoil the entire lot this way) but prepare one day at a time. Into each day put equal parts of faith, patience, courage, work (some people omit this ingredient and so spoil the flavour for the rest), hope, fidelity, liberality, kindness, rest (leaving this out is like leaving the oil out of the salad dressing – don't do it), prayer mediation, and one wellselected resolution. Put in about one teaspoon of good spirits, a dash of fun, a pinch of folly, a sprinkling of play, and a heaping cupful of good humour.

## Procedures for Marriage Arrangements -

Couples planning to be married must contact the priest at least one year in advance. This is an Archdiocesan law and applies to all parishes. At least one party must be a registered member of the parish. If either party has previously gone through any form of civil or religious marriage with another person, the priest is not permitted to set a date for the wedding until the Archbishop's office has been consulted. Once a date has been set with the church, then the other arrangements, such as the rental of a hall etc., can be made. In preparation for the marriage, the Catholic party should be attending Sunday Mass each week. The couple will also receive personal preparation for entering marriage through a Marriage Preparation program. Finally, the couple should remember that they are preparing mainly for a marriage, not a wedding. A wedding lasts one day, but marriage lasts forever!

## A Guide to St. Padre Pio Church

## BLESSED SACRAMENT CHAPEL " Then the sanctuary of God in heaven opened, and the Ark of the Covenant could be seen inside it."

The vision is the conclusion of the blowing of the seven trumpets in Revelation. The Ark of the Covenant, the most sacred object in the Temple of Jerusalem, is restored to God's people. The tabernacle, in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel, is in the form of the Ark of the Covenant, with the cross bearing the image of Christ as King and Priest. On the tabernacle stand are the letters Alpha and Omega, the first and last letters of the Greek alphabet. In the Book of revelation, Jesus says, "I am the Alpha and the Omega, the First and the Last, The Beginning and the End." The four stained glass windows depict the Choir of Angels – Seraphim and Thrones, Dominions and Virtues, Powers and Principalities, Archangels and Angels. The only Choir that is not depicted in the stained-glass windows are Cherubim, as they are on top pf the Tabernacle/Ark of the Covenant. The golden hue of the windows reminds us that we are in the Holy of Holies.

SHRINE OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY "Now a great sign appeared in heaven: a woman, adorned with the sun, standing on the moon, and with the twelve stars on her head for a crown."

The statue of Mary is the figure of Our Lady of Grace, to whom St. Padre Pio had a great devotion. To this has been added the crown of twelve stars and the moon at the base of the statue, reminding us that Mary is also the Woman of Revelation and the Queen of heaven and earth. The stained glass window surrounding Our Lady depicts the major shrines associated with her – Our Lady of Lourdes, France and Our Lady of Fatima Shrine, Portugal. The sun at the top of the window completes the image from the Book of Revelation – 'A woman adorned with the sun.' The two side windows depict St. Joseph, and St. Joachim and St. Anne, part of Mary's family – her husband and her parents.

Because of the extension of the lockdown until January 22<sup>nd</sup>, the Confirmations for: Tues. Jan. 12 (Public and Private Schools) Fri. Jan. 15 (Public & Private Schools) Tues. Jan. 19 (Pope Francis School) (St. Andrew School) Fri. Jan. 22 have been cancelled. As long as there is not another extension, the new dates for these Confirmations will be as follows: Sat. Jan. 23 @ 10:30am - (St. Andrew School) Sat. Jan. 30 @ 10:30am – (Pope Francis School) Sat. Feb. 6 @ 10:30am – (Public & Private) Sat. Feb. 13 @ 10:30am (Public & Private) All the other Confirmations from Jan. 26<sup>th</sup> to Feb. 16<sup>th</sup> will continue to be celebrated, **unless there** is another lockdown.



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
