Blessing of Throats - The blessing of throats has always been one of the most popular blessings in the Church. St. Blaise was bishop of Sebaste in Cappadocia, and was martyred by being beheaded about 316AD. Not much can be affirmed of him with any degree of historical accuracy, but stories about him are numerous.

One day so goes the legend, Blaise met a woman whose only pig had been snatched up in the fangs of a wolf; but at the command of the bishop, the wolf restored the pig alive to its owner. The woman did not forget the favour, for later, when the bishop was languishing in prison, she brought him tapers to dispel the darkness and gloom. To this story may be attributed the practice of using candles in bestowing the blessing of St. Blaise. While in prison he performed a wonderful cure on a boy who had a fishbone lodged in his throat and who was in danger of choking to death. From this account we have the longtime custom of invoking the Saint for all kinds of throat trouble.

"Through the prayers of St. Blaise, may God free you from ailments of the throat and from every other evil. In the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit," Amen.

Tuesday, February 2

Feast of the Presentation of the Lord

The feast of the Presentation of the Lord is celebrated 40 days after Christmas. Part of its theme is that of 'light'. On Christmas, 'the light shines in the darkness' and only a few 'receive it' – Mary and the shepherds at the manger. On Epiphany the light casts its bright beams upon Jerusalem (the Church), "the glory of the Lord rises over Jerusalem," and the Gentiles come flocking out of the darkness to the City of Light. Lastly on the feast of the Presentation, candles are blessed to take to our homes, a symbol of the Light being brought to the ends of the earth.

Blessed Candles – are available to take home. Blessed candles are lit in homes as a sign of honour to Jesus Christ, who is the light of the world. Some may light them before a picture or image of a saint as a sign of our trust in God's protection in times of storms or danger.

Prayer for use with Blessed Candles

"Blessed are you, Lord our God, creator of the universe and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ; you have sent your son to be the light of the world, and to call us to be your people of light. Let these candles remind us of Jesus as we work with Him to build up your kingdom. By his grace may we please you always and come into eternal light with you and your saints. Blessed and praised are you, God our Father, through Jesus Christ your Son in the love of your Holy Spirit, one God for ever and ever". Amen

Lent begins Feb. 17th in 2 1/2 weeks!

How am I going to observe Lent this year? How am I going to make this a time for penance and repentance, for almsgiving, prayer and fasting? what attitudes that are not pleasing to God do I need to change?

Lent is a time when Jesus wants to renew all the members of God's family and prepare others to be baptized into the Church. Two words describe the Lenten season clearly: Baptismal and Penitential

Baptismal: Lent is centered on baptism. For us who have been baptized into Christ, it is a time for renewing our baptismal covenant. We are to continue to die with Christ to sin and live with him for God. This renewal – which is an ongoing, lifelong task, is a time of final preparation.

Penitential: Lent is also a period of repenting and doing penance. It is a time when Jesus calls us to be serious in living out our baptismal promises. We are called to root out sin from our lives, to turn back to the ways of Jesus Christ. We are invited to fast and do penance as part of our daily carrying of the cross. We are also encouraged to build up God's Kingdom by placing God's will at the centre of our lives.

On Tuesday, Feb. 2, the Church celebrates the World Day of Prayer for Consecrated Life. The World Day for Consecrated Life is a wonderful opportunity for us to thank God for the gifts of these sisters, virgins, brothers and priests and to pray for God's blessing upon them in their efforts to faithfully live the evangelical counsels of poverty, chastity and obedience.

Sacred Relics in the Church

A sacred relic usually consists of physical remains of a saint or the personal effects of the saint or something associated with the saint for purposes of veneration. There are actually three classes of sacred relics. A first-class relic is a part of the saint's body. A second-class relic is a piece of the saint's clothing or something used by a saint. A third-class relic is an object which has been touched to a first-class relic.

In our church we have all three classes of relics. Near the statue of St. Padre Pio there is a case containing five relics of St. Padre Pio. In front of the statue is a relic glove of St. Padre Pio.

Near the statue of Mary there is a case containing three relics of St. Padre Pio and a relic of Pope St. John XXIII and Pope St. John Paul II.

In the altar, there is a first-class relic of St. Pius \boldsymbol{X} .

The stained-glass windows of St. Anthony and St. Francis contain relics. The stained-glass windows of the Life of Christ contain stones associated with each of the sacred sites.

Besides these, the church has a pair of gloves worn by St. Padre Pio, which are used at Healing Masses. There is also a piece of the Rock of Calvary and a Relic of the True Cross which are venerated on Good Friday. At Christmas, the large outdoor Nativity contains a stone from the cave of Bethlehem.
