Procedures for Marriage Arrangements

Couples planning to be married must contact the priest at least one year in advance. This is an Archdiocesan law and applies to all parishes. At least one party must be a registered member of the parish. If either party has previously gone through any form of civil or religious marriage with another person, the priest is not permitted to set a date for the wedding until the Archbishop's office has been consulted. Once a date has been set with the church, then the other arrangements, such as the rental of a hall etc., can be made. In preparation for the marriage, the Catholic party should be attending Sunday Mass each week. The couple will also receive personal preparation for entering marriage through a Marriage Preparation program. Finally, the couple should remember that they are preparing mainly for a marriage, not a wedding. A wedding lasts one day, but marriage lasts forever!

Epiphany – January 8

This feast comes from the East and may date back to the second century. Like the later Western feast of Christmas, it celebrates the Incarnation and work of the Son of God among us. In the East, it is not limited to the visit of the wise men, but involves the Incarnation, Birth, Manifestation and Baptism of the Lord. During the fourth century, the West adopted this feast and the East accepted Christmas. On the Epiphany we celebrate the revelation that God makes to the world in Jesus Christ. He is the image of the God whom we cannot see. He is the light of the world and leads us back to the Father.

The Epiphany concludes the Christmas cycle as we celebrate the ways in which God's love is manifested or revealed to us through His Son Jesus. As His Church, we are to continue to be the light of the nations, revealing God's love in Christ through our lives as His followers. The Christmas cycle ends with the feast of the Lord's Baptism.

Baptism of the Lord – January 9

At the beginning of His public life, Jesus was baptized by John in the Jordan: The Father proclaimed that Jesus was the beloved Son, the Spirit was poured upon Him to send Him on His mission; to free us from sin and to save the world. The Church sees our Lord's baptism as a model of our own, particularly of adults. In the blessing of baptismal water at the Easter Vigil His baptism is referred to as one of the signs of God's power at work among us. The feast of the Baptism of the Lord completes the work of the Christmas season. We have recalled God's marvelous deeds in the incarnation and birth of the saviour. We have answered His call to conversion and are ready to continue working with Him for the glory of God and the salvation of His people. With this feast we end the Christmas season and begin Ordinary Time.

On the feast of the Baptism of the Lord, it is fitting to give thanks to God for the gift of our own baptism.

"Blessed are you, Lord God, ruler of all creation; You have made us your beloved children, brothers and sisters of Jesus our saviour and temples of Your Spirit. Father, we thank you for making us, Christians; give us your help to continue dying to sin and to live with Christ for you. Lead all people into your Kingdom of light. All praise and glory be to you, Father, through your Son Jesus Christ, in the unity of your Holy Spirit, now and forever." Amen.
