FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Christos Anesti! Christ is Risen!

For our neighbors and their children, and sadly for many of our own children, Easter is not about the death and resurrection of Christ, but about bunnies and chocolate.

Yes, Virginia, there is an Easter Bunny!

You would think that our secular society would simply ignore Easter, but we are also a *consumer* society. How can we pass up an opportunity to make a sale? To continue to make the cash registers ring? We need to find a way to market Easter that has nothing to do with God.

So we have hot-cross buns without the Cross. We have the indulgence of chocolate without the austerity of Lent. We have eggs without recalling that the chick emerging from the shell is an image of Christ emerging from the tomb. After a long winter, we have our spring flowers without connection to the new life of the resurrection.

The only surprising thing is that we haven't replaced the word "Easter" with something innocuously unreligious like "spring holiday." But for most people the word Easter has already lost any religious connotation.

I suppose it was inevitable: just as the early Christians would "baptize" pagan festivals by turning them into celebrations of Christ or the Saints, so our secular society has "unbapitzed" our Christian festivals to remove any connection to Christ. Our pre-eminent Christian holy day is reduced to an Easter-egg hunt.

Yet, truly, Easter is the climax of the greatest story ever told. Raised up on a cross, Christ submits willingly to death, but death has no power to hold him. Rising triumphant from the grave, Christ breaks the power of death forever.

Jesus said to Martha of Bethany: "I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in me, though he die, yet shall he live. And whoever lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?" She replied: "Yes, Lord. I believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God."

One day I will die. The day and hour are known to God. Death will have me in its cold hard grip. But death will not be able to hold me. My soul will rise; not by its own power, but by the power of him who died for me.

Death, where is your victory? Death where is your sting? But thanks be to God, who has given us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ, Alleluia.

The greatest of all misfortunes is never to have known Jesus Christ. If we believe in Christ, then we are alive in Christ. If we are alive in Christ, we are truly alive.

Easter is the celebration of the victory life over death. "By his great mercy, God has given us a new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead." Rejoice in the Lord always. Again I say, Rejoice. What greater cause for rejoicing can there be? What greater cause for celebration?

Christos anesti! — *Christ is risen! Alithos anesti!* — *He is truly risen!*
