FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

The water-cooler Catholic.

Many years ago, when I was taking part in a parish Bible-study, one of our group would recount his workplace experiences as the "water-cooler Catholic." Whenever anyone in the office had some question about the Catholic Church he was the go-to guy for answers. Whether it related to something in the news or in their private lives, they turned to him as a reliable source of information. There were probably other Catholics in his office, but he was the one who got the job because he was casually up-front about his faith and approachable.

Nobody can be expected to have an answer for every question about the faith and the Church — a fool can ask more questions than a wise man can answer — but candor and sincerity go a long, long way. It is moreover an effective means of evangelization: informing others of the truths of our Catholic faith. What is required in this type of everyday evangelization is not eloquence but faithfulness.

The water-cooler Catholic certainly needs to be knowledgeable about the faith. As the old adage goes: *Nemo dat qoud non habet* — you can't give what you don't have. But that is true for *every* Catholic — as St. Peter says: "Always be prepared to make a defense to anyone who calls you to account for the hope that is in you, yet do it with gentleness and reverence."

As with most things, practice makes perfect. It is usually not comfortable being put on the spot, but that itself is a motivation to improve one's own knowledge. The best way to master a subject is to teach it. St. Augustine said: "I must also acknowledge, incidentally, that by teaching I have myself learned much that I did not know."

When I was working as an engineer, the office was mostly a religion-free environment. If there were any Catholics, they were flying below the radar. When I was leaving to enter the Seminary, many of my fellow workers came by to congratulate me. It was the first time that we recognized each other as fellow Catholics.

St. Theresa of Avila says: "The most we have to strive for in the beginning is to care for oneself alone and consider that there is nothing on earth but God and oneself — and this practice is very beneficial." When we are still "beginners" in the faith, it is natural that we should be too concerned about by own relationship with God to worry about others. But once we are established in our own faith we should be able to share our faith with holy boldness.

Jesus tells us: "You are the light of the world. No one after lighting a lamp puts it under the bushel basket, but on the lampstand, and it gives light to all in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others." It is not always comfortable letting our light shine, but as the Letter to Diognetus says: "God has assigned us such a high position, and we are not allowed to abandon it."
