

FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Science and religion.

In a CBC radio interview, atheist intellectual Malise Ruthven stated: "When I am in an airplane sitting next to a nun or rabbi I am sitting next to a *hypocrite* because their beliefs are contrary to the intellectual progress that made the design of this airplane possible."

This statement ignores the fact that the Wright brothers were faithful members of the Church of the United Brethren in Christ, and that many great scientists throughout history have been persons of sincere religious faith. Furthermore, there would not have been any 'intellectual progress' at all if it were not for the Catholic monasteries that preserved ancient learning after the fall of the Roman Empire.

Malise Ruthven, who thinks nuns are hypocrites, is intelligent and insightful when he is talking about things that lie within his field of expertise. Likewise, Christopher Hitchens was a widely respected journalist when he was not claiming that 'religion ruins everything,'. Stephen Hawking was famous for his work on 'black holes,' but when he said 'because there is a law of gravity, the Universe can and will create itself from nothing,' he was talking utter nonsense.

This is an illustration of what Pope Leo XIII wrote: "When men withdraw their intellect from the knowledge of divine truths, they are less fitted to succeed in the pursuit even of natural science. That is why we often see men of great intellectual power and erudition making the grossest blunders even in natural science."

Or, to state it bluntly as a universal law: "Atheism makes otherwise intelligent people say stupid things."

We are often told that science is opposed to religion. This is simply not true. To paraphrase St. Thomas Aquinas: Science is the knowledge of the causes of things. Natural things have natural causes. Super-natural things have supernatural causes.

When we are talking about 'science' we mean 'natural science' and we are in the realm of natural causes. When we are talking about faith and religion, we are in the realm of super-natural causes. There is therefore no opposition between 'science' and religion; rather there is a necessary *complementarity*. That is why Blaise Pascal could be both a great scientist and a theologian.

We should note that St. Thomas does make a further distinction. There is a 'cause of things' that lies between the natural and supernatural: human reason and will. Human reason is above nature, but it is not strictly supernatural. It can be the cause of 'natural things,' but it cannot itself be explained by natural causes. Human reason can explain the scientific laws that make an airplane fly, but scientific laws cannot explain human reason.

There is no hypocrisy involved in believing that natural things have natural causes, and that supernatural things have supernatural causes. Rather, it is just common sense. It is simply reasonable.
