
St. Paul the Apostle and Immaculate Conception Churches

FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

The greatest sadness — *not to be a saint.*

In last week's bulletin I mentioned Fr. Robert Barron's new series, *Catholicism: the Pivotal Players*. It has since been brought to my attention that only one of the Saints being profiled in that series is a woman: St. Catherine of Siena. St. Catherine is presented as the exemplar of the Christian mystic, one who is caught up in the love of God in prayer. It was suggested to me that it would be nice to have a series devoted specifically to great *women* saints.

It would be nice, but then again, it also seems to me that the Church is really "gender-blind" when it comes to the saints. There is no such thing a great woman saint — there are just great saints, some of whom happen to be women.

If you look at the Church's liturgical calendar, there is no distinction between male and female. The feast day of St. Vincent is followed by that of St. Agnes. The feast day of St. Augustine is followed by that of St. Monica. Both St. Benedict and his sister Scholastica have their days, as do St. Francis and St. Clair, as also St. Teresa of Avila and St. John of the Cross. Last year we had the canonization of two saints from Canada: St. Francois de Laval, first Bishop of Quebec, and Marie de l'Incarnation.

St. Paul tells us that in Christ there is neither slave nor free, neither Jew nor Greek, neither male nor female. The greatest saint of all time is, of course, the Blessed Virgin Mary. Jesus had many close friends and disciples, including Mary Magdalen, and Lazarus' sisters, Mary and Martha.

Ralph Martin's book, *The Fulfillment of All Desire*, is a "guidebook for the journey to God based on the wisdom of the saints." He takes as his guides seven recognized "Doctors of the Church": St. Augustine, Bernard of Clairvaux, Catherine of Siena, Teresa of Avila, John of the Cross, Francis de Sales and Therese of Lisieux. An amazing group of saints! Every Catholic needs to have read St. Augustine's *Confessions*, St. Teresa's *Life, The Introduction to the Devout Life* of St. Francis de Sales, and St. Therese' *The Story of a Soul* — all available in modern translations.

Some people seem to think that when Jesus instituted the Church he started it as a boys' club. No. The basic unit of the Church is the *family* — a father and a mother and their children. The purpose of the family is first of all the sanctification of the spouses. Your vocation — in the case of most people, this is marriage — is the primary means of your sanctification. This is the much-touted "universal call to holiness" — we are all called to be saints!

Within the Church, not all are called to marriage. Some are called to be Priests — to offer the sacrifice of the Mass and to administer the Sacraments. Some are called to a celibate life of prayer or service as monks or nuns, religious brothers or sisters. Some are called to the single life. Everyone, without exception, is called to be a saint.

Among the saints, some will be "great." Some of these great saints will be men, and some will be women.
