FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

The essence of Christianity — conversion and renewal.

These six Sundays of Lent will take us through to the first days of spring and the celebration of the Resurrection. *Christos anesti! Alithos anesti!* Christ is risen! Christ is truly risen! This brings us to the very heart of our faith. As St. Paul says: "If Christ has not been raised, then our proclamation has been in vain and your faith has been in vain. ... If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied."

There are many people who believe that the essence of Christianity is simply the "golden rule": do unto others as you would have them do unto you. They point to the parables of "the good Samaritan" and "the prodigal son" as showing the Christian virtues of love, mercy, forgiveness. The death of Jesus on the cross is seen as the ultimate example of sacrificial love — "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends." — "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do."

The golden rule, however, is not unique to Christianity. Versions of it can be found in many religions. This is not surprising, since it is a fundamental of the Natural Law — knowable by everyone, even if not admitted by everyone. The golden rule is part of the moral law that is built into the fabric of the universe, applicable to all people at all times. It is certainly one of the basic teachings of Christianity, but it is not the essence of Christianity.

The essence of Christianity is Christ. As St. Paul writes to the Corinthians: "For I decided to know nothing among you except Jesus Christ and him crucified." This is the core of the proclamation of the Gospel —

Now I should remind you, brothers, of the good news that I proclaimed to you, which you in turn received, in which also you stand, through which also you are being saved, if you hold firmly to the message that I proclaimed to you — unless you have come to believe in vain. For I handed on to you as of first importance what I in turn had received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the scriptures, and that he was buried, and that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. Last of all, as to someone untimely born, he appeared also to me.

The Good News is that Jesus has reconciled us to God and sent the Holy Spirit to be the life of our souls. Just as the soul gives life to the body, so the Holy Spirit gives life to the soul, and we are only truly alive when we are alive in the Holy Spirit. Jesus says of his disciples: "I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly!"

This abundant life in the Holy Spirit is the essence of Christianity. During this season of Lent we reflect on what it means to be a true disciple of Christ. Lent is a special time to approach God in prayer and in the Sacraments. Lent is a time for conversion and renewal.
