FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Sexagesima Sunday

According to the traditional calendar, this Sunday is called *Sexagesima*, i.e., "sixtieth." We now have only one more Sunday to go before the start of Lent. As we consider our spiritual program for Lent, we want to keep in mind those three pillars: prayer, fasting and alms-giving. Lent is a penitential season. Everyone, without exception, is called to observe Lent, in keeping with our individual circumstances.

For health reasons, you may not be able to fast from food, but you may be able to fast from television or social media. Your financial situation may be such that you cannot donate much to charity, but perhaps you can be more generous with your time. Everybody can pray.

The great challenge of Lent is making time. We are all so busy. But, then, that is the point. We are too busy with things that have nothing to do with God. One of the graces of Lent is that we are forced to readjust our priorities. Instead of giving God only the cold leftovers of our time, for a change we have to put Him first.

Establish the foundation. Begin with the Sacrament of Confession. Then recall that the Third Commandment is "keep holy the Sabbath." Holy Mass is the "first and indispensable source of the Christian life." All prayer during the week is an extension of the prayer of Sunday Mass. If you can, go to a weekday Mass as well. Go, not just because you have to, but because you want to.

When Jesus speaks about the prayer and fasting of the Pharisees, he says, "They have received their reward." He means that because they do these things only in order to be praised by men, then that is all they will get out of it. In the same way, if we go to Mass only in order to satisfy an obligation, then that is our reward; our ticket is punched. But if we go with open hearts in order to be filled with the Holy Spirit, then that is our reward.

The disciplines of Lent are the means of expanding our capacity to receive God's grace. We cut back on the things of the world, in order to spend more time on the things of God. St. John tells us, "Do not love the world or the things in the world. The love of the Father is not in those who love the world; for all that is in the world — the desire of the flesh, the desire of the eyes, the pride in riches — comes not from the Father but from the world."

Prepare the way of the Lord. First of all, go to Confession. Make Sunday Mass the cornerstone of the week. Attend a weekday Mass if you can. Come to Tuesday evening Adoration to pray before the Blessed Sacrament Come to the Stations of the Cross. Pray the Rosary daily. Make the Consecration to Jesus through Mary.

You cannot imagine the blessings that God has prepared for you this Lent, if only you will expand your capacity to receive them. Lent is not easy. It is not meant to be. The effort, however, will be richly rewarded, because God will not be outdone in generosity.
