FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Ash Wednesday.

This week we observe Ash Wednesday, which is a day of 'fast and abstinence.' According to Canon Law:

The law of abstinence [from meat] binds those who have completed their fourteenth year. The law of fasting binds those who have attained their majority [i.e., eighteen years], until the beginning of their sixtieth year. Pastors of souls and parents are to ensure that even those who by reason of their age are not bound by the law of fasting and abstinence, are taught the true meaning of penance.

Everyone between the ages of 18 and 59 is required to fast. The 'fast' is not arduous — you may eat one full meal and two smaller meals. If you are accustomed to a light breakfast and lunch, this simply means doing without snacks between meals. If you are not able to fast for reasons of health, some other penance can be substituted.

Even though children and seniors are not *required* to fast, it is still a good idea for them to do it, in a way that is suitable for their age and state of health. Ash Wednesday should *not* be just the same as every other day.

As St. Irenaeus said, "Man is not saved from the body, but in the body." Fr. Charles Arminjon expands on this fundamental truth:

Spirit and body are united by links so intimate and profound that, were it not for the instrumentality of the body, the spirit, by its very nature, would be unable to exercise any of its functions.

It is through the body that the mind reveals its power and exercises its kingship. It is the body that is the organ of the divine life and the sacraments. It is the body that is washed by the water of Baptism, so that the soul may obtain its purity and clarity. It is the body that is anointed with oil and the seal of the Holy Spirit, so that the soul may be consecrated. it is the body that crosses the hands in prayer and bows in adoration. It is the body that is emaciated by fasts and mortification. It is the body that receives the Eucharist so that man, becoming one with Christ, may live eternally.

Since we are a composite of body and soul, physical penance reflects our interior disposition. The physical necessarily accompanies the spiritual because whatever is done is done by the whole man.

Jesus suffered physically. In becoming incarnate (the divine second person of the Trinity taking on a human nature) Jesus chose not only to share our suffering but, by means of his suffering on the cross, to offer the atoning sacrifice for our sins. As St. Ephrem said: "Death slew Our Lord by means of the body which he had assumed, but that same body proved to be the weapon with which he conquered death."

During Lent, we are offered special graces to grow in our love of God. Through the practice of prayer, fasting and almsgiving we expand our hearts to receive these graces.
