## FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Religion a Weariness to the Natural Man.

Last fall, the main presenter at our Priests' Seminar was Fr. James Mallon. He had written a book about revitalizing the spiritual life of his parish in Halifax: "Divine Renovation — from maintenance to mission." In one of his talks, he related how he had encouraged one parishioner to get more involved in some of the parish activities, only to be told, "I'm sorry Father, but I'm just not that religious."

Fr. Mallon was taken aback by the comment, but most of the people that I know can be described as "just not that religious" and they are quite content to remain so.

Cardinal Newman had a great gift of seeing things as they truly are. In his day religion occupied a prestigious place in civic life of the English nation, but it did not occupy a significant place in the private lives of the people — they were content to live with a formal, distant relationship with God. Not that they were *atheist*, but religion really was such an awful bother. Newman delivered a sermon entitled *Religion a Weariness to the Natural Man*.

Newman began his sermon with a quote from the prophet Isaiah: "He had no form or comeliness that we should look at him, and no beauty that we should desire him." The natural man looks at Jesus and is repulsed by him rather than attracted. As St. Paul writes to the Corinthians: "The natural man does not receive the gifts of the Spirit of God, for they are folly to him, and he is not able to understand them because they are spiritually discerned."

The *natural* man, as Newman points out, is not attracted to Jesus. Yet, this is precisely what he will be judged on. "And this is the judgement, that the light has come into the world, and people loved darkness rather than light because their deeds were evil."

These are those of whom St. John writes in the beginning of his Gospel:

The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world. He came into the world, and the world came into being through him; yet the world did not know him. He came to what was his own, and his own people did not accept him.

Jesus, teaching in the Temple before his final Passover, said: "I do not judge anyone. ... The one who rejects me and does not receive my word has a judge; on the last day the word that I have spoken will serve as judge."

Every person has a moral obligation to seek the truth and to hold fast to it once found. Each of us has been created in God's image and we all have a supernatural destiny. Each of us is called into intimate relationship with Jesus Christ. Each of us is called to be "religious."

Jesus says: "No one can come to me unless drawn by the Father who sent me." St. Augustine comments: "Why He draws one and not another, seek not to judge if you do not wish to err. Are you not yet drawn? Pray that you may be drawn."


