FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Lent — making a good start.

Lent begins this week with the observance of Ash Wednesday, "to begin with holy fasts the exercises of Christian warfare, that as we do battle with the spirits of evil, we may be protected by the help of self-denial."

St. John warns us against "love of the world — the lust of the flesh, the lust of the eyes and the pride of life." During Lent we especially take this warning to heart. For the next six weeks we will step back from our hectic pursuit of worldly things so that we can re-orient ourselves to God.

Jesus gave us the example. Just as he was forty days in the desert, confronting head-on the wiles of Satan and the temptations of the world, so we too enter a spiritual desert. Lent is given to us as a sacred season of conversion and renewal — a time to break free from the habits of sin and to acquire habits of virtue, above all the habit of prayer.

God wants to fill us abundantly with the gifts of his grace but we need to make room to receive them. St. Augustine in a homily 1500 years ago spoke of this:

The entire life of a good Christian is in fact an exercise of holy desire. Suppose you are going to fill some container, and you know you will be given a large amount, then you set about enlarging the container. Why? Because you know the quantity you will have to put in it and your eyes tell you there is not enough room. By expanding it, therefore, you increase the capacity of the container.

Such is our Christian life. By desiring heaven we exercise the powers of our soul. So, my brethren, let us expand our hearts. Let us continue to desire, for then we shall be filled.

God's love in unconditional. The gifts of God's grace are freely given to all who desire them — but they have to be *desired*. There has to be a hunger for that which only God can give. We receive in proportion to our desire. Let us then increase our desire.

In the second Preface of Lent we offer this prayer:

For you, Father, have given your children a sacred time for the renewing and purifying of their hearts, that, freed from disordered affections, they may so deal with the things of this passing world as to hold rather to the things that eternally endure.

Lent is a time to free ourselves from our bondage to whatever holds us back in our relationship with God. It is a time to empty ourselves so that we may be filled.

All the prayers of the Church during this time help us to do this. Each Sunday the readings and prayers of the Mass are all directed to this one end — to express our desire for conversion and spiritual renewal. All our devotional practices, especially the Stations of the Cross, are intended to expand our hearts to receive all the abundant graces that God wants to give us.
