#### FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

The love of that which ought to be loved.

You don't have to go to Church to be a good person. You don't have to be Catholic or Christian. You don't even have to believe in God. A non-church-going Atheist can be a good person just as much as a God-believing Church-going Rosary-praying Catholic. According to the ancient Greek philosophers, a "good" person is one who consistently, and as a kind of second nature, lives the four moral virtues of prudence, justice, temperance and fortitude.

Justice is giving to everyone what is his due and doing what one knows is right — it is being fair to everyone in all things at all times. *Temperance* is using good things in moderation — not too much and not too little. *Fortitude* is courage — the willingness to face danger or to suffer harm in pursuit of what is right. *Prudence*, the highest virtue of all, is the wisdom to know what is right.

If this is the definition of "good," then I can think of many people who live good, virtuous lives, sometimes to a superlative degree, who are not Catholic or who are not even Christian.

So then, if you don't need to go to Church to be a good person, and if you don't need to be Catholic to be a good person, then why bother being a Church-going Catholic?

Because, to put it simply, "being good" has nothing to do with it. Christ did not come for you to be a good person! The world knew about the four moral virtues of prudence, justice, temperance and fortitude long before Christ. These are human virtues — they are simply part of living a rational well-ordered life — they are common to humanity.

What truly defines us as Christians are virtues that the ancient pagan world and our modern secular world know nothing about: Faith, Hope and Charity (Love). These Christian virtues do not make you a good person — they make you a holy person. Christ did not come so that we might be good — he came so that we might be holy. The teaching of Jesus on the Christian life could not be clearer. Love God with all you heart, all your soul, all your mind and all your strength. And love your neighbor as yourself. Everything else follows, including the moral virtues.

St. Augustine says: "In this life, virtue is nothing else but the love of that which ought to be loved. To choose this is *Prudence*; not to be turned away from it by any difficulty is *Fortitude*; or by any seducement, and that is *Temperance*; or by any pride, and that is *Justice*. But what must one choose for one's first love if not that Good than which there is no better? That is God. And if we place any other thing over him in our love, or on the same level, we do not know how to love ourselves."

The Gospel is not about being good, it is about loving God. You get to Heaven not by being good, but by wanting more than anything to be in God's presence forever. We don't go to Church to be good. We go to Church because we love God and want to be in his presence now.
