
St. Paul the Apostle and Immaculate Conception Churches

FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

The conviction of faith.

"Faith is a conviction, not a consciousness" — when I came across this statement many years ago I did not know what to make of it. Since that time I have come to see the truth of it. Certainly we are conscious of our having faith, but we are not ordinarily conscious of the object of our faith, which is God himself.

We can perceive material objects only through our five senses — sight, hearing, taste, smell and touch. Since God is not made of matter, we cannot perceive him directly. We can also have an intellectual knowledge of the nature of things that are perceived, the how and why of the things. But again, since God is not a thing of this world, we cannot even have this kind of intellectual knowledge about God.

We can only indirectly come to the knowledge of God through the things that he has made; through what St. Augustine calls the *vestigia Dei*, "the fingerprints of God":

Some people in order to discover God, read books. But there is a great book: the very appearance of created things. Look above you! Look below you! Note it; read it. God, whom you want to discover, never wrote that book with ink; instead he set before your eyes the things that he made. Can you ask for a louder voice than that? Why, heaven and earth shout to you: "God made me."

This imprint of God on created things is especially evident in the greatest of all his creations: man — made in the image and likeness of God. In man's intellect and free will we see a reflection of God's own attributes. In man's capacity for love and sacrifice, we see a reflection of God's infinite love. As St. Irenaeus says: man fully alive reveals the glory of God. Although this knowledge of God is not a result of direct perception or consciousness it is no less real.

Normally, we do not *feel* God's presence. The action of the Holy Spirit in our souls is so deeply interior that we are usually not aware of that action. Often, it is only by looking back on our life that we see the influence of grace.

We know that there are many things even in nature that we cannot sense, such as radio waves, which are constantly all around us and even passing through us. We lack the ability to directly perceive them but we do not deny that they are present. In order to capture them we need a radio receiver. Is there a receiver for God? Yes. It is called faith.

Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen. ... Without faith it is impossible to please God, for whoever would approach him must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who seek him.

Faith is not something unusual or extraordinary. It is not a gift limited to the lucky few. It is merely opening one's eyes to see what is all around us, the "book not written with ink" which shouts "God made me!"
