FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Evangelization and marketing the Gospel.

We are used to the idea of companies and organizations "re-inventing" themselves to adapt to changing circumstances. Innovation, it is said, is the key to success. According to business guru Peter Drucker:

Because its purpose is to create a customer, the business enterprise has two — and only these two — basic functions: marketing and innovation. To satisfy the customer is the mission and purpose of every business. For this reason alone, any serious attempt to state 'what our business is' must start with the customer's realities, his situation, his behavior, his expectations, and his values. The aim of marketing is to know and understand the customer so well that the product or service fits him and sells itself.

It is evident that the Catholic Church today is having difficulty attracting and holding on to her "customers". Some say that this failure is due to a lack of innovation.

We are now observing the 50th anniversary of the Second Vatican Council which took place in the 1960s. The watchword of the Council was *aggiornamento* — Italian for "bringing up to date." In a way, the Council was about responding to the needs of the 20th and 21st centuries.

One of the major innovations that came out of the Council was an update of the way Mass was celebrated. Some of our older parishioners remember the days when the most common form of Mass was the so-called "low Mass" — no music or singing, the prayers being said by the priest silently in Latin, "with his back to the people." If you wanted to receive Communion you had to refrain from all food and drink from the previous midnight. Communion was received kneeling and on the tongue. What occurred after the Council was indeed an extreme makeover.

However, although the "look and feel" of the Mass changed drastically, there was no change in the doctrine of the Mass. The Mass was and remains what it has always been — the making present of the sacrifice of the body and blood of Jesus on the cross. What changed were the outward forms: the inner reality cannot change.

A look at the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, now twenty years old, is enough to dispel any notion that what we believe as Catholics changes with the seasons. The Church does indeed consider the "customer's" realities, expectations and values. The mission of the Church, however, is not to *affirm* these values — now so often diametrically opposed to Christian values — but to offer an alternative. That may not be an "easy sell" in today's world, but the Church is not a "business enterprise." Our mission is to proclaim the Gospel, "in season and out of season."

As St. Paul exhorts us: "Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God —what is good and acceptable and perfect."


