#### FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Matter and spirit; nature and grace.

Around the year 250 B.C. a Greek geographer named Eratosthenes correctly calculated the earth's diameter. The scientists of his day knew that the earth was a sphere. If you travel in a perfectly straight line, veering neither left nor right, you do not fall off the edge of the world but, rather, you come right back to the place where you started. The earth has no edge; it is a continuous curved surface.

Albert Einstein, a couple millennia later, discovered that the universe also has no edge; it is a continuous curved space. If you travel through space in a perfectly straight line, veering neither left nor right, up nor down, you arrive back at your starting point. To put it another way: if you had a powerful enough telescope, you would see the back of your own head. Strange but true.

We can easily visualize a curved surface. We cannot visualize curved space even though we can describe it mathematically and prove it scientifically. We live *in it* without being naturally aware *of it*, just as we do not normally notice that we are living on the surface of a ball.

But there is much more to reality than just physical matter and spatial dimensions. The natural sciences investigate only one aspect of reality. The intellect of Albert Einstein can encompass the entire physical universe, but that intellect does not have its origin in physical matter.

St. Thomas Aquinas was one of the greatest intellects of all time. He said that science is the knowledge of causes. He further noted that physical things have physical causes, intellectual things have intellectual causes, and spiritual things have spiritual causes. We human beings are body and soul — matter and spirit.

Just as the intellect is superior to physical matter not only in degree but in kind, so the spiritual is not only vastly above the intellect but it is in a completely different category. The intellect is ordered to understanding the physical universe and to interaction with other intellectual beings. The spiritual brings us into contact with the source of all reality — physical, intellectual and spiritual — which is God himself.

Reality is more than matter. Matter is in fact the least part of reality. "The grace even of one man is a greater good then the whole universe of nature."

Ask the common person of this modern age what lies beyond the life of the physical body and they can give no definite answer. When the trajectory of their lives brings them to the edge of their physical existence, do they then just fall off?

We do not live in a purely material, three-dimensional world. Reality is infinitely greater than that. As the poet Gerard Manley Hopkins put it: "The world is charged with the grandeur of God." As beings created in God's image and likeness, we know that the earth is not flat — we are intimately aware of the spiritual dimension of life.
