FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Lectio divina — reading the Bible.

One of the fundamental principles of the Protestant Reformation is *sola scriptura* — "only the Bible." Martin Luther, the Augustinian monk who started the Reformation in 1517, thought that every individual believer was able on his own to come to a right understanding of the Bible, under the personal guidance of the Holy Spirit. Although this idea sounded good when it was first proposed, it quickly broke down in practice as other "reformers" each interpreted the Bible in his own way.

The consequence is that there are literally thousands of separate Protestant denominations, all believing that their distinctive doctrines are based on the Bible. Evidently the Bible is not as easy to read as Luther supposed.

St. Francis de Sales — one of the great saints of the Catholic Reformation — offered the following observation:

If Scripture is so easy to understand, then why all these Protestant interpreters and preachers? If you are faithful, you will understand the Scriptures just as well as they do. Send them off to unbelievers. If you can feed yourselves in the field of the Scripture, what do you want with pastors? Some mere child who is able to read the Bible will do just as well.

As far my own understanding of Scripture goes, despite years of study, including courses in Greek and Hebrew, I am still only a beginner. The good news is that God did not drop the Bible into our laps and say, "Read this and figure it out for yourself." God gave us the Bible — and he also gave us a teacher to guide us in making sense of it. Christ founded a Church, *mater et magistra* — mother and teacher.

So how do we, as Catholic Christians, read the Bible? We read it in light of the constant and consistent teaching of the Church for the last 2000 years. When we read the Bible we do not read it alone. We read it as members of the Body of Christ, the Church. We read it together as a spiritual community united in the one faith and in continuity with the saints and the Doctors of the Church: Ignatius of Antioch, Irenaeus, Athanasius, Augustine, Bernard, Thomas Aquinas and all those innumerable other saintly men and women who came before us in the Church.

Indeed, Scripture is inspired by the Holy Spirit, and it is understood best by those who are most alive in the Holy Spirit. That is why we look to the Saints. St. Teresa of Avila, though she had no formal education, had a much more profound understanding of Scripture than I ever will.

We read Scripture in light of the Church's Tradition. You and me and Cardinal Collins and Pope Francis are all part of that Tradition. We did not create it. We were born into it when we were washed in the waters of baptism. It is our sure guide, because the Church is from Christ.

Even when we are physically alone, we always read Scripture within the community of Christ's Church. This is the true *lectio divina* — "divine reading."
