
St. Paul the Apostle and Immaculate Conception Churches

FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Christian saints and Catholic culture.

Fr. Robert Barron is currently working on a new video series: *Catholicism: The Pivotal Players* — "A new journey to unlock the truth behind the Catholic Church's most influential people: a handful of saints and scholars who not only shaped the life of the Church but changed the course of civilization."

St. Paul tells us that the Church is a body composed of many members. "And God has appointed first apostles, second prophets, third teachers, then workers of miracles, then healers, helpers, administrators, speakers in various kinds of tongues." Fr. Barron considers the saints who are the archetypes of certain spiritual gifts. He looks at the martyr, the teacher, the monk, the theologian, the reformer, the artist, the founder of a religious order, the mystic, the social activist, the evangelist and the convert.

It is interesting to see which saints have been chosen to be representatives of the various manners of living a life of holiness. Fr. Barron focuses on "pivotal players." A pivot implies a change of direction, a new way of adapting the demands of the Gospel to changing circumstances. Throughout history there have been holy men and women who changed the course of events. They had an impact in their own day and are still important today.

The saints show us what it means to be Christian, to live as true disciples of Christ without compromise. In the saints we see the reality of the power of the Holy Spirit working in weak people, for God's power is made perfect in weakness. "When I am weak, then I am strong."

As the epitome of the "martyr," Fr. Barron has chosen St. Irenaeus. It is Irenaeus who said, "Just as the soul gives life to the body, so the Holy Spirit gives life to the soul. Only when we are alive in the Spirit, are we fully alive."

The "teacher" is St. Augustine. The sheer quantity of his writings that have come down to us is astounding: books, homilies, letters — all laboriously and lovingly copied out by hand. His most treasured book is *The Confessions*, the story of his conversion. *The City of God* sounds the death knell of the old paganism and announces the beginnings of that Christian civilization to which we are the often unmindful heirs.

The "monk" is St. Benedict. The "theologian" of course can be none other than St. Thomas Aquinas. Of the many reformers, St. Francis is chosen, and of the mystics, St. Catherine of Siena. Two "modern" writers are included: Cardinal Newman (1801-1890) and G. K. Chesterton (1874-1936), both English converts to the Catholic Church.

It is said that Catholic faith is not possible without a Catholic culture. Part of that culture is knowing our story — knowing those great men and women who changed the world by bravely living and proclaiming the Gospel. They have lived in every century, in every circumstance. Bravo to Fr. Barron for telling us their story and ours.
