FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Religious Accommodation.

When we hear the phrase "religious accommodation" used instead of the phrase "religious freedom" or "religious rights," we need to be concerned. A "freedom" or "right" can be claimed as one's due. An accommodation is like a favor — it is not owed, it is merely conceded. When our secular society thinks that it is doing us a favor by letting us live our religious faith, there is a problem.

I heard one secular pundit say with regard to the Church's teaching against same-sex marriage: "Freedom of religion does not trump freedom of equality." In other words, if we get with the program and if we march in step with secular society then maybe we can get along. But we should not presume on so-called religious "rights." From the secular point of view, it is self-evident that we religious people are wrong, and wrong doesn't have any rights.

The HBO series *Band of Brothers* tells the story of a company of the U.S. 101st Airborne during the Second World War. At one point, they are sent to defend the city of Bastogne. Warned that the German Army is about to cut off the only remaining road out of the city and they will be completely surrounded, their response is this: "We're paratroopers. We're *supposed* to be surrounded."

The purpose of airborne troops is to parachute behind enemy lines and operate in enemy territory. That is what they are trained for. It is why they exist, their *raison d'être*.

It is the same with us Christians. We are also trained to operate in enemy territory — in the midst of a secular culture. We are *supposed* to be surrounded. Are we going to complain about it? How can we? It is simply part of being a disciple of Christ. "If you belonged to the world, the world would love you as its own, but I have chosen you out of the world — therefore the world hates you." (John 15:19). Those are strong words, but they were spoken by Christ, and spoken to us.

Cardinal Newman said: "The world at large, not only is not Christian, but cannot discern or understand the Christian." We all know this from our own daily lives. Here we are, living in a community among neighbors and friends who are like us in so many ways — working together, enjoying much the same entertainment, shopping at the same stores — but when it comes to the most important things, the most *essential* things, they just don't "get" us. As it says in the Psalm: "I have become a stranger to my brothers, an alien to my own mother's sons." Maybe this is a situation to lament, but it is part and parcel of discipleship.

The Jewish Philosopher, Hannah Arendt, wrote: "If one is attacked as a Jew, one must defend oneself as a Jew. Not as a German, not as a world-citizen, not as an upholder of the Rights of Man, or whatever. But: What can I specifically do as a Jew." The same applies to us Christians. When we are attacked as Christians, we need to defend ourselves as Christians and not settle for "religious accommodation."
