

FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Nobody has a monopoly on truth?

As Catholics we are in the non-politically-correct position of saying that we *do indeed* have a monopoly on truth. Jesus is the Way, the Truth and the Life. Nothing can be truer than the Catholic faith. Jesus is truly the eternally begotten Son of God. He assumed a human nature, was born of the Virgin Mary, died on the cross and was laid in a tomb. On the third day he rose again. After ascending into heaven he sent the Holy Spirit.

This is the faith that we proclaim every Sunday. The Nicene Creed is not a statement of *opinions* but a definite statement of *facts*. In professing the Creed we assert these things to be *true*. The Creed does not allow for compromise or "nuance." It declares what *is*.

We are in an age of relativism where such bold declarations of religious faith are not acceptable. Because if Jesus is *who he says he is* then the Jewish people have failed to recognize their Messiah, Muhammad is not a prophet, Krishna is not a god, and none of us have Buddha nature. If we Catholics are right then every one else is wrong.

Such is the nature of truth: it excludes the contrary. To be a Muslim is to accept the Qur'an exclusively as the word of Allah and to reject all other religions. To be a Christian is to accept Jesus as the Word of God. As St. Paul said: "God desires all men to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth. For there is one God; there is also one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus, who gave himself as a ransom for all, the testimony to which was borne at the proper time." With Pope Leo XIII we believe: "The greatest of all misfortunes is never to have known Jesus Christ."

As Christians, we respect the rights of conscience and freedom of religion. We may believe that people are wrong in what they believe, but they have a God-given right to be wrong. As we say with respect to freedom of speech: "I disapprove of what you say, but I will defend to the death your right to say it."

The problem today is not inter-religious intolerance, but intolerance of religion. We see this most clearly in the Wynne government's imposition of an immoral sex-ed curriculum in our public schools. This is presented as a moral imperative. Under the banner of "tolerance," personal and religious beliefs that are contrary to the progressive sexual and gender ideology will not be tolerated. This is an "enlightened" totalitarianism in which *error has no rights*.

Hannah Arendt, a Jewish philosopher who fled Nazi Germany, wrote: "If one is attacked as a Jew, one must defend oneself as a Jew. Not as a German, not as a worldcitizen, not as an upholder of the Rights of Man, or whatever. But specifically as a Jew." When attacked as Christians, as Catholics, we need to stand up for ourselves *as Catholics*. As Cardinal Newman wrote: "This may not be the age of Saints, but all times are the age of martyrs."
