

FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Living in the Truth of Christ.

In Plato's Protagoras, the story is told of how the various human arts were given to men by the gods:

Then Hermes asked Zeus: "How should we distribute shame and justice to humans. Should we distribute them as the other arts? For if one person practices the art of medicine, this suffices for many ordinary people; and so also with the other arts. Or should justice and shame be distributed to all?" Zeus replied: "Let all have a share; for cities can never prosper if only a few possess these, as is the case with the other arts. Establish this law as coming from me, and death to him who cannot partake of shame and justice, for he is a pestilence to the city."

This story gives a mythical account of what we call the "natural law," that understanding of right and wrong which is hard-wired into our human nature. It is often the case that, because of our free will, we choose to act against our nature and do what we know is wrong. But still, our evident need to rationalize and justify our acts is itself a witness against us of our innate sense of justice and shame.

The Roman statesman Cicero also spoke of a natural law common to all men:

There is in fact a true law — namely, right reason which is in accordance with nature and applies to all men. Neither the civil government nor the people can absolve us from our obligation to obey this law, and it requires no teacher to expound and interpret it. It does not lay down one rule at Rome and another at Athens, nor will it be one rule today and another tomorrow. But there is one law, eternal and unchangeable, binding at all times upon all peoples; and there is one common master and ruler of men, namely God, who is the author of this law. The man who will not obey it will abandon his better self and deny the true nature of man.

Pope John Paul II in his landmark encyclical, Veritatis Splendor — "The Splendor of Truth" — spoke of a "crisis of truth" in our own times, when the fundamental principles of morality are being denied or distorted. He wrote:

Once the idea of a universal truth about the good, knowable by human reason, is lost, inevitably the notion of conscience also changes. There is a tendency to grant to the individual conscience the prerogative of independently determining the criteria of good and evil and then acting accordingly. This individualism leads to a denial of the very idea of human nature.

St. Paul said that even the gentiles have the law "written on their hearts." This is the natural law to which every human being is subject. As Christians we recognize that we are created in God's image and likeness. Relying on the authority of Scripture and Holy Tradition we endeavor not only to live by the universal moral law but, more than this, we strive to live in the Truth of Christ.
