FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Pope Francis in Israel

As expected, the news media are most interested in the political aspects of Pope Francis' trip to Israel. Was the Pope able to help resolve the Arab-Israeli conflict that has been going in that region for the last hundred years? The answer is "no." Nobody honestly expected to see any diplomatic breakthroughs.

We often assume that all people actually want peace. We forget that sometimes "even peace can come at too high a price." Everyone believes that some things are worth fighting for. Israelis believe that a Jewish state is worth fighting for. Some Palestinians believe that the elimination of that state is worth fighting for. There is a real conflict of interests. On each side there is something vitally important at stake that is considered more important than peace. Sometimes there is no easy way to resolve such conflicts.

Nevertheless, it is good to see that Pope Francis is looked on as a promoter of peace and a mediator. The Church is often accused of being constitutionally anti-Semitic and anti-Muslim. There is indeed a real "clash of cultures" between Christianity and Islam, but for the most part we have found a way to live in mutual respect.

Of course, the Church is neither against Jews nor Muslims (nor Buddhists nor Hindus). The Church desires that all people come to the saving knowledge of Jesus Christ, but we also believe that faith cannot be coerced — it is a matter of the heart and the will.

The Catholic Church does have a role to play in promoting justice and peace in every part of the world. Where "Vatican diplomacy" can advance the cause of peace, the Pope has a right and duty to use his influence for the accomplishment of this goal. When it comes to world politics, the Pope is also a "player." He is different however from the other players, because he is not promoting his own agenda, but honestly working for the good of all.

In all of this we need to remember that the Kingdom of God is not of this world. Justice and peace are always our goal, but given the reality of fallen human nature, it will always be out of reach. There will always be conflict.

As Aleksandr Solzhenitsyn learned in the Soviet gulag: Gradually it was disclosed to me that the line separating good and evil passes not through states, nor between classes, nor between political parties either — but right through every human heart — and through all human hearts. This line shifts. Inside us, it oscillates with the years. And even within hearts overwhelmed by evil, one small bridgehead of good is retained. And even in the best of all hearts, there remains an unuprooted small corner of evil.

In considering the problems in our own society and around the world, we pray first for the conversion of our own hearts — afterwards we expand that prayer to include the conversion of all people and nations.
