FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

The splendor of truth.

Let everybody preach Christ when occasion offers, and he is at once a martyr. For sometimes a person, though not suffering persecution, dreads being put to shame. He may have, for example, to live among pagans and he is ashamed of being known as a Christian. But if ashamed of a man he lives with how can he expect to withstand a persecutor? So, preach Christ wherever you can, to whom you can and as you can. It is faith that is demanded of you, not eloquence; let your faith speak for you, and then Christ will speak. For if faith abides in you, then Christ too abides in you. — St. Augustine

We are indeed living in a world turned upside down: our culture celebrates and indeed takes pride in what rightly ought to be a cause of deep shame; and we Christians are too often ashamed of what we ought to boldly proclaim. We are increasingly subject to bullying and harassment, but our situation cannot be compared to that of Christians in many parts of the world who are severely persecuted, even to the point of actual martyrdom.

St. Paul preached the Gospel in a pagan world. Often imprisoned, five times he received the thirty-nine lashes; three times he was beaten with rods; once he was stoned and left for dead. Yet, in spite of it all, he writes from his prison cell to Timothy: “This is my gospel, for which I am suffering even to the point of being chained like a criminal. *But God’s word is not chained.*”

Cardinal Robert Sarah, in his book, *God or Nothing*, considers “the best path for the Church”:

The major concern must continue to be God. The circumstances and developments in the world surely do not help us to give God his proper place. Western societies are organized and live as though God did not exist. Christians themselves, on many occasions, have settled down to a silent apostasy. If the concerns of contemporary man are centered almost exclusively on the economy, technology, and the immediacy of material happiness that has wrongly been sentimentalized, God becomes distant; often in the West the last things and eternity have unnecessarily become a sort of psychological burden.

Well, then, given this existential abyss, the Church has only one option left: she must radiate Christ exclusively, his glory and his hope. She must immerse herself more deeply in the grace of the sacraments, which are the manifestation and the continuation of God’s saving presence in our midst. Only then will God be able to find his place again. The Church proclaims the Word of God and celebrates the sacraments in the world. She must do all this with the utmost honesty, a genuine rigor, a merciful respect for human miseries that she has the duty to lead toward the “splendor of truth.”

Is it fair that Canadians must agree with the government to be eligible to participate in a federal program? Groups applying for the 2018 Canada Summer Jobs grant were required to indicate their agreement with certain beliefs held by the current federal government. This contravenes the Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms, which guarantees the freedom of religion and conscience, of thought, belief, opinion and expression, as well as “equal protection and equal benefit of the law without discrimination.”
