
St. Paul the Apostle and Immaculate Conception Churches

FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

"We learn from our mistakes"

How often we hear this phrase — I myself have said it many times — and yet it is simply not true. There has not been one single person in the entire history of mankind who has ever learned from making a mistake. However, we all may learn by admitting our mistakes and *correcting* them. It is not then the mistake itself, but rather the effort we put in to correct it which is the *cause* of our learning. As St. Francis de Sales said:

We can draw benefit even from sin if it brings us to knowledge of self, to humility and contrition. A good man's fall makes him afterward walk straighter and more carefully. Not indeed that sin helps us, or can work in us any good, for sin is in every sense bad; nevertheless, it may be the occasion of a great good which it could never of itself produce.

We are apt to say that God can bring good out of evil, but even this is not strictly true. God permits evil so that it may become an occasion for him to do some great good. When the sons of Jacob sold their brother Joseph into slavery in Egypt, it was an evil act, but God used it to save them from famine. What the brothers intended for evil, God used for good. In God's providence, evil never has the last word, because the grace of God is always stronger in its goodness than evil in its malice.

As St. Paul says, "Where sin abounded, grace superabounded! What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin that grace may abound? By no means!"

Yet today many people believe and teach that we must do evil in order to know evil. They say that just as we cannot know the difference between sweet and sour without tasting both, so we cannot know that something is evil until we actually try it. But in fact evil is a deadly poison — we cannot taste it without being harmed.

St. Augustine says:

There are two ways of knowing evil. One by which it is known by the power of the mind, the other by which it is known by experience. The way a wise man's learning knows evil is quite different from the way a foolish man's bad life knows it.

We often make mistakes. We often choose to do the evil rather than the good. As Cardinal Newman said: "We walk to heaven *backwards* — by sinning, by suffering, by correcting ourselves, by improving." But we know that we may not do evil deliberately so that good may come; rather, by sincerely *repenting* of our mistakes and by *correcting* them, we become wiser. Through God's mercy then even our sins may be an occasion of grace. Let us pray to God that we may indeed learn from our mistakes — but how much better to avoid them in the first place. As the ancient proverb says: "He who does not learn from others' mistakes, has no cure for his own."
