FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Plans for summer vacation.

For most people summer is a time to slow down and take things easy. It doesn't always seem to work that way. While there is much less going on in the parish in July and August, that only means that there is time to tackle larger projects. Years ago, Fr. Tad began a project for developing a computer database for St. Paul's Cemetery. The project never got off the ground. Last July, I was able to create a new Excel program, and we have slowly been filling in the data a little at a time.

The bigger job last summer was to review our book-keeping system. When I first arrived in the parish this was one of my top priorities. However it was a much bigger job than I had anticipated and it had to be put on hold. Last summer, I finally buckled down for the weeks of drudgery of going through all of our income and expense statements and we were able to reorganize our accounts. Previously, all the rectory expenses, for example, were being lumped together without any way of separating out the costs for fuel oil, electricity, phone, etc. This satisfied the accountants but it wasn't much use for financial management. Now we can record individual income and expense items separately.

This summer, my first job will be to review the accounts of the past year and see how things have worked out and what other improvements need to be made.

The big job for this summer will be developing plans for our Family of Faith projects. It has been about eighteen months since we ran the Family of Faith campaign and the money is gradually building up in our contingency fund. We need to begin sharpening our pencils, getting some ideas sketched out on paper and estimating construction costs.

The main Family of Faith project is the upgrade of our church courtyard for improved safety and accessibility. Currently, we have serious problems with puddles and freezing. The roof downspouts discharge onto the walkways and create dangerous ice pads in the winter. As well, the curb at the edge of the patio stones is an accessibility barrier and a tripping hazard. The wheelchair ramps are inadequate and slippery when wet. We are proposing to remove the curb, to repave the courtyard with adequate slope for proper drainage and to eliminate the downspouts. We will also build an enclosed storage space where the old Church bell now sits. This will be used to store tools and outdoor maintenance equipment. We are also looking at improving accessibility for Immaculate Conception Church.

Since I was previously a Professional Civil Engineer, I am excited about sitting at the drawing board and putting some ideas on paper. We will have to consider carefully our budget constraints — building renovation costs can easily get out of hand. Still, I am hoping that we will be able to put in code-compliant accessible washrooms at both Churches.

They say that a change is as good as a rest. I am looking forward to a busy and productive summer.
