

FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

'Efficient' men or 'ipse Christus'?

I bring up the issue of married priests again because even some admirably faithful lay Catholics are saying, "Maybe this is something that we should be looking at." They personally know married priests, either former Protestant ministers ordained under the 'pastoral provision' or priests in one of the Eastern Rites. These priests are well-educated and prayerful men. They celebrate the Eucharist with reverence and provide much-needed pastoral care. Why would we *not* want more of them? As one American bishop put it, "Does maintaining a celibate clergy have a higher value than providing Sacraments to our people?"

If we see the priest only in functional terms then it does seem practical to ordain married men. If the main concern is to 'provide Sacraments,' then almost anybody can be suitably trained to do those sacred functions. A qualified lay person can provide pastoral counseling, or run a parish. Why should we have celibate priests at all?

As I previously quoted Cardinal Robert Sarah:

The crisis of the priesthood is one of the main factors in the crisis of the Church. We have taken away the priest's identity. We have made priests believe that they need to be 'efficient' men. But a priest is fundamentally the continuation of Christ's presence among us. He should not be defined by what he *does*, but by what he *is*: *ipse Christus*, Christ Himself.

The word 'efficient' is a translation of the original French 'efficace,' i.e., efficacious or effectual, something that effectively 'gets the job done.' Is it enough to have 'efficient' men? Is this what God intended when he promised, "I will give you shepherds after my own heart"?

Pope Benedict XVI, twelve year ago, in his Apostolic Exhortation, *Sacramentum Caritatis*, wrote:

There is a need to reaffirm the profound meaning of priestly celibacy, which is rightly considered a priceless treasure. This choice on the part of the priest expresses in a special way the dedication which conforms him to Christ and his exclusive offering of himself for the Kingdom of God. The fact that Christ himself, the eternal priest, lived his mission even to the sacrifice of the Cross in the state of virginity constitutes the sure point of reference for understanding the meaning of the tradition of the Latin Church. Celibacy is really a special way of conforming oneself to Christ's own way of life.

In continuity with the great ecclesial tradition, with the Second Vatican Council and with my predecessors in the papacy, I reaffirm the beauty and the importance of a priestly life lived in celibacy as a sign expressing total and exclusive devotion to Christ, to the Church and to the Kingdom of God, and I therefore confirm that it remains obligatory in the Latin tradition. Priestly celibacy lived with maturity, joy and dedication is an immense blessing for the Church and for society itself.
