FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Challenges and opportunities

When I was a Structural Engineer I designed paper mills and process plants. The most important consideration for these types of buildings is that they be functional. No one cares about aesthetics. And yet, anything which is well-ordered and functional does have a kind of beauty.

Currently, I am trying to come up with a practical design for the renovation of the Church courtyard. The primary consideration is that the courtyard be safe and accessible. However, it also needs to be functional from an architectural standpoint and that brings up a whole range of other challenges and possibilities.

The first thing that needs to be kept in mind is that the courtyard is more than just a means of getting from the parking lot to the Church doors. It is in its own right an important part of the Church building. It functions as a transition from the public thoroughfare to the sacred space of the Church — from the City of Man to the City of God.

We see this pattern of transition notably in the Temple in Jerusalem as it existed in the time of Jesus. The Temple was laid out as a series of concentric courtyards of increasing sacredness. The first courtyard was the court of the gentiles, where all people were welcome to pray. The next courtyard was for the people of Israel only. Then there was the courtyard for the priests with the altar of sacrifice. Then at the very center, the Holy of Holies, where only the high priest entered once a year.

We see a similar pattern of in our Catholic Churches as well. Our Holy of Holies is the Tabernacle, which stands at the central high point at the front of the Church. The next area is the Sanctuary, the Altar area, which is reserved for the sacred ministers. Next there is the nave of the Church where all the faithful worship. Beyond that is the narthex or foyer, which is a place of greeting and has its own liturgical function — for example, in the rite of Baptism it is where the Priest welcomes the family. Beyond the narthex is the outdoor area, the courtyard, which is used liturgically at the Easter Vigil for the blessing of the Easter Candle.

As a transition space, the courtyard should be welcoming; an inviting place where one naturally tends to linger for conversation. We are fortunate to have a southfacing courtyard which is sheltered from the wind.

The main challenge is that we do not have a visible connection to the street. The Church is not visibly linked to the larger community and we do not form part of an identifiable neighborhood. This is not so much a problem that needs to be fixed as a challenge to be met.

If we are to maximize the benefit of any retrofit project we need to look at it as more than simply replacing paving stones to fix problems. The necessity of addressing the safety and accessibility issues also creates an opportunity to meet some of the architectural challenges. It is an opportunity for creativity.
