
## St. Paul the Apostle and Immaculate Conception Churches

#### **FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:**

A still more excellent way.

On the day of Pentecost, when Mary and the Apostles were praying behind closed doors, the Holy Spirit broke in on them and turned their world upside down. With their hearts set on fire by the Spirit, the Apostles rushed into the street and began to proclaim boldly the good news of Jesus Christ. The crowd that gathered around them was overcome by their powerful testimony. The people asked, "What should we do?" Peter replied, "Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ so that your sins may be forgiven; and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit."

When we were baptized we received the Holy Spirit to be the life of our souls. If we have let the fire of the Spirit burn down to warm coals, then we need to fan those coals back into life and rekindle the fire. That was the purpose of the *Life in the Spirit Seminar* which we hosted in this parish — to invite the Holy Spirit to again be the life of our souls. As I never tire of repeating: Just as the soul gives life to the body, so the Holy Spirit gives life to the soul, and we are only truly alive when we are alive in the Holy Spirit!

We should not ever be afraid of the Holy Spirit or the spiritual gifts associated with the *Life in the Spirit*. St. Paul himself in his first letter to the Corinthians describes the spiritual gifts including the gifts of prophecy and healing and speaking in tongues. In fact he says, "I thank God that I speak in tongues more than all of you." He encourages us to "strive for the spiritual gifts and especially that you may prophesy." But he also says this: "And I will show you a *still more excellent way*. If I speak in the tongues of men and of angels, but do not have love I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal." We all know how the rest of it goes. It ends, "And now faith, hope and love abide, these three, *and the greatest of these is love*."

The lives of the Saints are so many examples of what it means to live in the Spirit. Lately, I have been reading the biographies of St. Teresa of Avila and St. John of the Cross, who together did so much to revitalize the Church in the 1600's and whose influence has extended far beyond their own place and time; both have officially been declared Doctors of the Church. Although neither of the them spoke in tongues, their writings are luminous with the inspiration of the Spirit. They are shining examples of what God can accomplish in a soul that is open to the gifts of the Spirit.

These Saints were exceptional; but, then, *every* Saint is uniquely exceptional. As St. Paul says, "There are a variety of gifts, but the same Spirit." Each one of us is also exceptional. We need only to allow the Holy Spirit to fill us with the greatest of his gifts, which is love.

St. John of the Cross, at a time of trial, wrote to a friend: "As to my affairs, let them not trouble you, as none of them trouble me. Think only that God ordains all. And where there is no love, put in love and you will find love."
