FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Love comes from you; marriage comes from God.

The Catholic Church does not have a "position" on marriage — what we have is Christ's teaching on marriage:

Have you not read that he who made them from the beginning made them male and female, and said, "For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh"? So they are no longer two but one flesh.

This is not the merely the Christian "ideal" of marriage; it is God's plan for marriage "from the beginning." Certainly to carry out this plan is not easy in our secular society, but as Pope John Paul II said: "Marriage is a sign of the victory which Christ grants to couples in resisting the forces which deform and destroy love."

In my usual wedding homily I quote from a letter that Dietrich Bonhoeffer wrote to a newly married couple:

Marriage is more than your love for each other. It has a higher dignity and power, for it is God's holy ordinance, through which he wills to perpetuate the human race till the end of time. In your love you see only your two selves in the world, but in marriage you are a link in a chain of the generations, which God causes to come and to pass away to his glory. In your love you see only your own happiness, but in marriage you are placed in a position of responsibility towards the world and mankind. It is marriage, and not merely your love for each other that joins you together. Love comes from you, but marriage comes from God. It is not your love that sustains your marriage but your marriage that sustains your love.

What we see in the world around us today is not, as some would claim, the "broadening" of the definition of marriage. It is rather the deconstruction of marriage as a noble social institution. Pope John Paul insists that "marriage and family constitute one of the most precious of human values." Note that he says "human" values.

In Familiaris Consortio, Pope John Paul writes:

In its most profound reality, love is essentially gift, and married love does not end with the couple, because it makes them capable of the greatest possible gift, the gift by which they become cooperators with God for giving life to a new human person. Thus the couple, while giving themselves to one another, give not just themselves but also the reality of children, who are a living reflection of their love, a permanent sign of conjugal unity and a living and inseparable synthesis of their being a father and a mother. Their parental love is called to become for the children the visible sign of the very love of God.

We can't change the world. But we can choose not to be conformed to the world. As Christians we are called to be an image of God's love in the world. To bear witness to the immense value of marriage "is one of the most precious and most urgent tasks of couples in our time."
