FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

A Key to the Doctrine of the Eucharist

I was going to write something about the importance of this feast of *Corpus Christi* (Body of Christ), but the best thing that I have read concerning this wonderful truth of our faith has been written by the great Abbot Anscar Vonier, in a book published in 1925 and recently reissued. Here is what Abbot Vonier writes in his introduction to the book:

If it is my duty to teach a Catholic child his Catechism, I will tell him that at Mass is offered up to God the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ as a sacrifice. This is a lesson the child will understand at once; he knows that the Body and Blood of Christ were separated at one time, as the story of the Cross is easily grasped by the Catholic Child; he soon learns something about the sacrifices of the Old Law; so this proposition that the Body and Blood of Christ are offered up as sacrifice is by no means beyond the measure of his little mind.

Left in this elemental form the theological proposition may follow a man though his whole life, and he will never be puzzled by it, just as he is not confused by that other thing he has learned in childhood, that his soul had been cleansed by the water of Baptism, or that his sins were forgiven him whenever he went to Confession in sincerity of heart.

If Mass is all that and only that, — the Body and Blood of Christ offered up in sacrifice — then our Catholic worship becomes easy. There could be no two ways of understanding an idea presented with such extreme literalness, because every man would know what is meant by Christ's Body, what is understood by Christ's Blood, what is signified by a sacrifice.

When Christ announced in the synagogue of Capernaum that he would give his Flesh to eat and his Blood to drink, there was no doubting his meaning. Many of his followers called it a hard saying and no longer walked with him. Men can always behave in such a fashion. My concern is not with them in that mood. I have a more agreeable mission to fulfill.

I want to prove to the believer that after everything has been said, after a careful study of all the issues and of all the implications of so great a mystery as is the Eucharist, we have all of us to come back to our spiritual infancy. We have to hold that the fullness of Eucharistic truth is contained in this: that Christ's Body and Christ's Blood, nothing more, nothing less, nothing holier, nothing lower, is offered up on the Catholic Altar. The Catholic sacrificial rite is what all sacrificial rites have always been, a separation of the living blood from the living body; the superior privilege of Christendom is in the infinite sanctity of the two things, Body and Blood. — Abbot Vonier.
