### FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Beginning the forty days of Lent.

On this first Sunday of Lent we begin the familiar sequence of Gospel readings: the temptation of Jesus in the desert; the Transfiguration; the Samaritan woman at the well; the healing of the man born blind; the raising of Lazarus; then, on Palm Sunday, the Passion narrative. Because Lent is traditionally a time of preparation for those who are going to be baptized at the Easter Vigil, these readings are especially selected for their instruction. We can see these readings as a compendium of the entire Gospel.

The temptation in the desert marks the beginning of Jesus' public ministry. After being baptized by John the Baptist in the river Jordan, Jesus goes out into the wilderness for forty days.

Anthony Esolen comments on the nature of these temptations:

Perhaps we can see it more clearly if we consider two of the temptations. For Satan brought Jesus to a hilltop, and spread out before him "all the kingdoms of the world in a moment of time." "All this power will I give you," said Satan, "and the glory of them: for that is delivered unto me; and to whomsoever I will give it. If you therefore will worship me, all shall be yours."

The temptation was perhaps more subtle than we know. Certainly throughout Galilee and Judea there must have been many people whose insides were gnawed by hunger. Why not take the plan of God into your own hands, so to speak, and start writing the story yourself? Why not turn the stones into bread and feed the multitudes?

Or look at all the kingdoms of the world, the Persians ruled by despots and their all-too-efficient bureaucrats, the Romans imposing law and peace upon their subject peoples at the point of a sword, the barbarian tribes beyond the Roman frontiers, living half by herding cattle and half by war and plunder. Why not, for the sake of all those suffering peoples, assume immediate lordship over them, and bring justice to them all?

But that would be like saying, "I, and not the Father, am going to determine the course of human history. And He will have no choice but to let me do it."

Throughout his public ministry, Jesus continually tells people not to publicize his miracles. The people of Israel were waiting for the coming of the Messiah who, as a descendent of King David, would rule over a restored nation of Israel, freed from Roman rule. Purposely, Jesus rejected the role of a political leader.

Jesus did not come to establish a nation-state, but to establish the New Covenant, which is for all people, both Jew and Gentile. Jesus would do this, not by raising armies to battle the Roman legions, but by offering himself as a victim on the cross. In the desert he is tempted to establish his Kingdom by an easier way than by suffering.
