
St. Paul the Apostle and Immaculate Conception Churches

FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

I once was blind but now I see.

For the Sundays of Lent we are given a series of long readings from the Gospel of John. The readings have this in common: they are all about conversion.

The *transfiguration* — Jesus reveals to his closest disciples a glimpse of his true divinity. This is a sign of Jesus' glorious resurrection on Easter morning, after the pain and sorrow and the seeming defeat of the crucifixion.

The woman at the well — a Samaritan woman comes to draw water from Jacob's well and encounters a stranger, a Jewish man, who offers her "living water." She tells him: When the Messiah comes, he will proclaim all things to us. Jesus: I am he — I am the Messiah. The Samaritan woman is converted along with many of the other townspeople.

The *man born blind* — Jesus tells the blind man to wash in the pool of Siloam, and he is able to see. The Pharisees ask: Who opened your eyes? He says: A prophet. The Pharisees say: Give glory to God; we know that this man is a sinner. The man replies: I don't know if he is a sinner; one thing I do know, that though I was blind, now I see.

The *raising of Lazarus* — the brother of Mary and Martha is four days in the tomb. Martha says: Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died. The people say: He opened the eyes of the blind; could he not have kept this man from dying? Jesus commands Lazarus to come out from the tomb, and he does.

We see in these episodes different aspects of spiritual conversion — the close encounter with Jesus and the sudden recognition of him as the Messiah. Like the man born without the gift of sight, our eyes are now opened. We were spiritually dead, but now we are alive in the Holy Spirit. The glory of Jesus is revealed to us — and we are awe-struck. Like the Samaritan woman, this encounter changes us forever. We can never go back to being the person we were before encountering Jesus.

We talk about intellectual "enlightenment" — suddenly for the first time seeing things clearly as they truly are, without illusion. Conversion is a spiritual enlightenment. It is a realization that we are God's special creation: "For I am the Lord your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Savior. You are precious in my eyes, and honored, and I love you."

Conversion is not imaginary or metaphorical. It is real. It is the overwhelming flood of God's grace into our souls. It is a process — the sometimes long process of dismantling the obstacles that we have put in the way of our encounter with Christ. But it is a process that culminates in a singular moment: often a difficult moment of surrender to God's love, like St. Augustine's conversion in the garden. For others it is a moment of quiet recognition: as Cardinal Newman describes it, a moment of knowing that you know.

Truly, the greatest of all misfortunes is never to have known Jesus Christ. "God, how good you are to those who seek you but, how much more to those who find you."
