FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Six Popes: John XXIII to Francis I

This past Thursday, 13 March, was the first anniversary of the election of Pope Francis. Looking back, it is surprising that only two weeks after the unexpected resignation of Pope Benedict, we had a new Pope greeting the crowds at St. Peter's Square. Unlike a political election, there was no election campaign and no self-proclaimed candidates. The media pundits were profiling the "front-runners," but no one correctly predicted the outcome.

It is said that the Church is not a democracy. True enough — the people, the *demos*, do not vote for our bishops or the Pope. But there is a careful selection process. When there is a vacancy in a diocese — bishops are now required to retire at age 75 — there is a painstaking search for a worthy successor. This involves discussions with prominent clergy and lay people, active bishops and the Congregation of Bishops in Rome. A short list is presented to the Pope who makes the final decision.

It is not strictly democratic but there is a wide consultation. Considering the necessary qualifications for a new Bishop, the pool of candidates is not large. As a teacher of the faith, he will have a solid academic background — usually a Doctorate in Scripture, Theology or Canon Law. He will have proved himself as an able administrator. He will also be a model of Christian discipleship — a man of deep faith and prayer, a pastor of souls.

If a Bishop demonstrates exceptional ability, the Pope may make him a Cardinal. The Cardinals are advisors of the Pope. One of their most important duties — exercised only at long intervals — is the election of a new Pope. Our Archbishop, Cardinal Collins, was appointed by Benedict XVI and took part in the election of Pope Francis.

It is certainly open for discussion whether the procedure for selecting Bishops and the Pope can be improved. Personally, I do not see how anything positive can come out of politicizing the selection process. We can certainly point to some disastrous appointments — Bishops who egregiously failed in their pastoral duties — but this by no means characterizes the college of Bishops as a whole.

The past two centuries have seen a string of excellent Popes. My favorite is Leo XIII who was Pope from 1878 to 1903. John XXIII was elected in 1958 and he stunned the world by calling the Bishops of the world together for the Second Vatican Council. He died while the Council was still in session. The work of the Council was completed by Pope Paul VI. One of the prominent Bishops at the Council, Karol Wojtila, became Pope John Paul II in 1978. His task as Pope was to implement the teachings of the Council.

On April 27th of this year, Divine Mercy Sunday, both John XXIII and John Paul II will be canonized — declared Saints. It might not be democracy, but it says something for the current process for selecting the head of the Church that two of the last six have been canonized Saints.
