FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

On being good without God

There are many, who in the conduct of this present life can certainly be called good people. For all practical purposes they observe what is prescribed in the law. But, because they do all this without knowing to what end it is ordered, they do it in vain. However worthwhile good works may appear to men, without faith such works are nonetheless without meaning. They strike me as so much energy and haste expended in the wrong direction. What makes a work good is the end in view. Faith points out the end in view. — St. Augustine

An eminent Catholic theologian, commenting on this passage, wrote: "In view of such texts it can be asked whether St. Augustine has not overlooked the fact that all men who really do good — that is, who lead a life of real benefit to society — are on the way to their final destiny, whether they know it or not."

Did Augustine get it wrong? Of course not. Augustine did not "overlook" anything. Rather he saw clearly that every action is necessarily directed to an end. For example, if I wash the dishes, the end in view is a cupboard full of clean dishes, ready to be used. If I follow a program of diet and exercise, the end in view is good health. These are naturally good things to do; they are each, according to the end in view, both worthwhile and meaningful.

However, if I want clean dishes, it would be a waste of time to sweep the floor. It may appear worthwhile, but it is not to the purpose. In the same way, if the final end of man is everlasting life in heaven, then anything that is not directed to that end, whatever its secondary merits may be, is only wasted effort. As St. Augustine would say, "It is great strides but off the road."

St. Teresa of Avila says the same: "While in a state of mortal sin the soul will find profit in nothing; none of its good works will be of any avail to win it glory; for they will not have their origin in the First Principle, which is God, through whom alone our virtue is true virtue."

St. Augustine and St. Teresa are only repeating what is written in the Letter to the Hebrews: "Without faith it is impossible to please God. For whoever would draw near to God must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who seek him." This has always been taken to include those who have not had the Gospel preached to them but whom St. Paul describes as "having the law written on their hearts." Good deeds are truly good when undertaken not for some merely natural end but in order to please God. This is made possible with the assistance of grace.

Every vocation is a religious vocation. Everything that we do ought to be directed to our true end, which is God. Along the way, we also have to wash dishes and look after our health, but always keeping the ultimate end in view. As St. Paul says, "I regard everything as loss because of the surpassing value of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord."
