## FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

What are you giving up for Lent?

In the old days the Church prescribed a Lenten fast one full meal and two small meals — and abstinence from meat on Fridays. Now the only required days of fast and abstinence are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. But we are still required — not just encouraged, but actually required — to do some voluntary acts of fast and prayer and alms-giving throughout the forty days of Lent.

For alms-giving, we have the Share Life campaign. Our donations to Share Life are distributed to Catholic charities throughout the Archdiocese of Toronto. Share Life is an extremely effective way to assist those in need. As Christians we are obliged to help the poor. Scripture, both the Old and New Testaments, is insistent that we must reach out and provide for those who cannot provide for themselves, according to our means.

For prayer, Lent is an ideal time or all of us to establish better habits of prayer. This may mean being faithful to morning and night-time prayer, or praying the Rosary every day or the Divine Mercy Chaplet. Above all, during Lent we should make an effort to pray the Stations of the Cross.

We pray the Stations in the Church every Friday of Lent at 7:00 pm. I simply can't imagine Lent without the Stations of the Cross. Yes, it requires effort and commitment, but spiritual exercise is like physical exercise: you have to put in the effort to get the benefits. Think of the Church as a spiritual gym and the Stations as a spiritual workout.

If it has been a while since you attended a weekday Mass, Lent is the time to do it again. Not everyone can get to Mass at 8:00 am on a weekday morning, but many can attend Mass on Tuesday evening at 7:00 pm and on Saturday morning at Immaculate Conception Church at 9:00 am. We can all use the additional graces.

When was the last time you made a Holy Hour? We have a Holy Hour every Tuesday evening at 6:00 pm. Not sure what a Holy Hour is? Come and find out. And if you want a real prayer workout, come join our Life in the Spirit Prayer Group for a time of full-out praise and worship.

Do you have some spiritual reading lined up? Since last September we have had a library in the choir room. Make use of it. Browse for a good book and sign it out.

For fasting, we can stick with the traditional Lenten fast or we can give up something else. It is fine to give up chocolate or other junk food. Go forty days without alcohol or caffeine. Give up television, internet or social media. Be creative. Use this time of grace to give up a bad habit.

Lent is about both giving up and taking on — giving up some unnecessary pleasures and taking on some useful spiritual exercises. It is a time of increased spiritual and physical discipline. Lent is a season of great grace if we are willing to challenge ourselves and take advantage of it.
