
St. Paul the Apostle and Immaculate Conception Churches



FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

The Reality of That Which Surpasses Understanding

The recent film, *The Theory of Everything*, is a biography of a brilliant scientist, Stephen Hawking. The title refers to his quest to find a single universal theory that explains all the physical laws of the universe. This "theory of everything" is the Holy Grail of physicists. Hawking has spent most of his life searching for it, without even coming close to finding it. It remains frustratingly elusive.

I have admired Hawking since reading his most popular book, *A Brief History of Time*. That book was one of the many sign-posts that pointed me to God. That is a curious result, considering that Hawking is an outspoken atheist.

Of course, science can neither prove nor disprove the existence of God. Still, fundamental philosophical questions attract the interest of scientists as much as anyone else, although scientists are particularly ill-equipped to deal with them. Scientists, the brilliant ones not excepted, are apt to think that everything can be explained by science.

But as the late Fr. Neuhaus has commented:

Over the past three hundred years, there have been thousands of books, each one published in the confidence that it provides the final knock-down argument demonstrating that there is no God and that once this truth is recognized all belief and action premised upon the reality of God will cease and desist.

I have in my time read more than my share of arguments for atheism and have yet to encounter one that is aimed at debunking the God in whom I believe. Put differently, I, too, do not believe in the God in whom they do not believe. The reality of that which surpasses understanding is not disproved by the recognition that it surpasses understanding.

One of great philosophical questions — one that points to the necessity of a Creator — is the question: "Why is there something rather than nothing?" Why does the universe exist at all? Why do we exist?

Prof. Hawking believes the answer can be found in the theory of the "multiverse" — the idea that our universe is only one of an infinite number of completely independent universes each with its own unique set of physical laws:

The multiverse concept can explain the fine tuning of physical law without the need for a benevolent creator. Because there is a law of gravity, the Universe can and will create itself from nothing. Spontaneous creation is the reason there is something rather than nothing, why the Universe exists, why we exist.

As G. K. Chesterton once said: "When a man ceases to believe in God, he doesn't believe in nothing — he will believe in anything." Even, it seems, spontaneous creation from nothing! There is indeed a "theory of everything" — the ultimate explanation of all that is or ever will be. It is not a scientific theory. It is what we call "God."


