#### FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Via Crucis — the Way of the Cross

Easter is exactly six weeks away. God desires that this time be for us a time of special blessings; a time in which he abundantly pours out his graces upon us. God's generosity is limitless; but we place limits on our capacity to receive God's gifts. It would a tragedy if we did not take advantage of this season of Lent; we will not get this time back again.

One of the great prayers for this time of year is the Stations of the Cross. In early times, pilgrims would travel to the Holy Land to visit the sacred sites. The most important of these sites was the Holy Sepulcher, Jesus' tomb, the place of his burial and resurrection. Pilgrims would gather at the site of the Praetorium, where Jesus was condemned to death, then walk the route along which Jesus carried his cross, ending at the tomb. Along the way they would stop to pray. When the pilgrims returned home, they put up pictures of these prayer stations in their own Churches. The popularity of this devotion spread quickly and soon became part of our common Catholic heritage.

The essence of the Stations is meditating upon the passion of Christ. Jesus came into the world in order to suffer unjustly at the hands of men, to be killed and then to rise again. Jesus offered himself as a sacrifice for our sins. This was the ultimate act of love. Even though he suffered at our hands — it was we who shouted "Crucify him! Crucify him" — Jesus offered his suffering as atonement for our sins, saying, "Father, forgive them,"

When we do the Stations of the Cross, we begin the prayer for each station with "We adore, O Christ, and we praise you, because by your holy Cross you have redeemed the world." Praying the Stations, we enter into the mystery of our redemption. On Easter morning we will celebrate the Resurrection — *Christos anesti!* — but before the resurrection comes suffering and death. This is the theme of Lent and the theme of the Stations of the Cross. As the hymn says: "When I survey the wondrous cross, on which the prince of glory died, my richest gain I count but loss, and pour contempt on all my pride."

In a homily on the Cross, St. Ephrem of Edessa said:

Death slew our Lord by means of the body which he had assumed; but the same body proved to be the weapon with which he conquered death. Death could not devour our Lord unless he possessed a body; and so he came in search of a chariot in which to ride to the underworld. This chariot was the body which he received from the virgin; in it he invaded death's fortress, broke open its strong-room and scattered all its treasure. He raised up the cross to span the jaws of death like a bridge by which souls might pass from the region of the dead to the land of the living.

The three pillars of our Lenten observances are prayer, fasting and alms-giving. Of these, prayer is the most important. If our prayer is right, everything will be right.
