#### FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

#### A call to conversion.

Behold, I stand at the door and knock. If any one hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in to him and eat with him, and he with me. — Rev. 3:20.

God is calling us to a deeper conversion. It would be an unspeakable tragedy if we were to go through the remaining five weeks of Lent with the attitude of 'business as usual.' Jesus is knocking at the door. If we do not open the door to our Lord now, at this instant, when will we do it? As St. Paul says to the Corinthians, "Now is the acceptable time; now is the day of salvation."

What is holding us back? We all desire a closer relationship with God. We all yearn for the Holy Spirit to be more fully the life of our soul, yet we experience what Fr. Thomas Dubay has called 'a remarkable resistance.' He writes, "It is no exaggeration to say that if we lived one percent of what we hear and see and read in our Catholic liturgies in a year or a month, we would have been saints long ago." Fr. Dubay offers a 'surefire program' to overcome our resistance: deep conversion comes about by conversing with God in deep prayer.

But, as the late Fr. Benedict Groeschel said, "The very thing that keeps us from such effective and powerful prayer is the fear that it actually might transform us." We fear what the Holy Spirit might accomplish in us if we truly allowed him free rein. Surely, He will take us out of our 'comfort zone.' Here we need to recall the words of Pope John Paul II: "Do not be afraid! Open wide the doors to Christ!"

In my own life, answering the call to conversion led me to leave my comfortable life as a professional engineer to enter the Seminary to study for the priesthood. For most of my life, the idea of being a priest never entered my mind. But as my great saint, St. Augustine said, "When God wants to bestow on you a great gift, he first gives you the grace to pray for it." God gave me the grace of my vocation; but first he gave me the grace to desire it.

The greatest sadness is that so many people never find their true vocation. It is not the case that Christ is failing to call them. He is calling, but they are failing to hear his call because they are not living a life of conversion and prayer.

Every vocation is a *religious* vocation. For every single one of us, our vocation is our primary means of growing in holiness. The vocation of marriage and family is just as holy as that of the cloistered nun or the monk. The demands and sacrifices are different, but married life needs to be grounded in prayer just as much as religious life.

The well-known painting by William Holman Hunt called 'The Light of the World' shows Jesus knocking at the door. The painter was criticized because he forgot to put a door-latch on the outside of the door. But it was not a mistake; as he pointed out, the latch is on the *inside*. Jesus is standing at the door and knocking. It is up to us to 'open wide the door to Christ' and to let him in.

The federal government has tabled legislation to expand what they refer to as medical assistance in dying but is more accurately called euthanasia/assisted suicide. More than 13,000 Canadians have been euthanized since 2016. New legislation would make assisted death available to those without life-threatening illnesses including those with disabilities and those no longer capable of making decisions for themselves. ### **Update on Coronavirus for Parishes**

Our goal is to act responsibly, based on credible information from reliable sources. We have been in regular contact with local health officials and will continue this dialogue. Information from the provincial website (<u>Ontario.ca/COVID-19</u>) provides basic background on the coronavirus and practical advice for all organizations:

Coronaviruses are spread mainly from person to person through close contact, for example, in a household, workplace or health care centre.

There are everyday actions that can help prevent the spread of germs that cause respiratory illnesses. Take these everyday steps to reduce exposure to the virus and protect your health:

- wash your hands often with soap and water or alcohol-based hand sanitizer
- sneeze and cough into your sleeve
