
St. Paul the Apostle and Immaculate Conception Churches

FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

If anybody is preaching to you another gospel ...

Seven years ago, on May 10th 2008, Cardinal Collins laid his hands on my head and ordained me to the priesthood. I still haven't got entirely used to the idea of being a priest. Yet there is nothing in the world more certain than that God has called me to this vocation.

People ask, "What made you want to become a priest?" They expect a simple answer, but there isn't one. I started showing up at Mass on Sunday; I found an old Rosary in my junk drawer and started praying it; I found the writings of St. Teresa of Avila in a second-hand book shop; I joined a Catholic Bible-study group. One thing led to another.

As Cardinal Newman pointed out:

Grace is present in the heart of every man in real sufficiency for his ultimate salvation. Not that the grace is such as at once to bring him to heaven; but it is sufficient for a beginning. It is sufficient to enable him to pray for another grace; and that second grace is such as to pray for a third; and thus the soul is led from grace to grace, and from strength to strength.

It is hard to determine which was the first grace, and which the second, and in fact there came so many graces, one upon another, that it is difficult to enumerate them.

Every single one of us is called to be a disciple of Christ. We are called to be disciples not because we are holy; but so that we may become holy. Every vocation is a religious vocation! For each of us, our vocation is the primary means of our sanctification. Most people are called to the vocation of marriage and family, and it is in meeting the challenges of family life that they grow in holiness.

These are challenging times in which to live the faith, but we must be absolutely clear about one thing: This Catholic Faith is not of human origin. As St. Paul says:

Am I now trying to win the approval of men, or of God? If I were still trying to please men, I would not be a servant of Christ. I want you to know, brothers, that the gospel I preached is not something that man made up. I did not receive it from any man, nor was I taught it; rather, I received it by revelation from Jesus Christ.

A former Christian who took up Zen Buddhism said: "It took me twenty years to see through the hypocrisy of Christianity." I thought, "And how long will it take to see through the hypocrisy of Buddhism?" It is in fact necessary to see through the hypocrisy of Catholics if we are going to have a genuine Catholic faith. When we see past all the faults and failings that we bring to the Church, there stands the *real* Church, which is a divine organism, the mystical body of Christ, animated by the Holy Spirit.

This is the substance of our faith: "Jesus Christ, the power of God and the wisdom of God." Let us hold fast to Christ. As Pope Leo XIII said: "The greatest of all misfortunes is never to have known Jesus Christ."
