

FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

March for Life, Ottawa, 8 May 2014

The promotion of the culture of life should be the highest priority in our societies. If the right to life is not defended decisively as a condition for all other rights of the person, all other references to human rights remain deceitful and illusory. — Saint Pope John Paul II

The *March for Life* takes place in Ottawa every year in May. It is not a protest. It is not a demonstration. It is a peaceful and prayerful *witness* to the dignity and value of human life from the moment that life begins.

The law in Canada allows the destruction of the child at any time before or even *during* the act of giving birth, even when the child is at full term and completely developed.

The German Jewish philosopher Hannah Arendt wrote: For it is quite conceivable, and even within the realm of practical possibilities, that one fine day a highly organized and mechanized humanity will conclude quite democratically — namely by majority decision — that for humanity as a whole it would be better to liquidate certain parts thereof. Here, in the problems of factual reality, we are confronted with one of the oldest perplexities of political philosophy, which could remain undetected only as long as a stable Christian theology provided the framework for all political and philosophical problems, but which long ago caused Plato to say, "Not man, but a god, must be the measure of all things."

Arendt was writing at a time when such things were known to have happened under Nazism and Communism. Now this is the normal state of things in Canada.

As Christians we absolutely believe in the sacredness of human life from the moment of conception. To deny this is simply to reject Christianity.

When we recite the Creed on Sunday we say that Jesus "was incarnate of the Virgin Mary and became man." "Incarnate" refers to the moment of conception — that instant in time when God took assumed our human nature. Jesus was fully human — "like us in all things but sin" — from the moment of his conception. Mary was sinless from the moment of her conception in the womb of her mother Anne. John the Baptist "leapt in the womb" of his mother Elizabeth. Psalm 139 says:

For it was you who created my being, knit me together in my mother's womb. I thank you for the wonder of my being, for the wonders of all your creation. Already you knew my soul my body held no secret from you when I was being fashioned in secret.

Mother Theresa of Calcutta called abortion "the greatest destroyer of peace" because "it is a war against the child, a direct killing of the innocent child." We are all implicated in the tragedy of abortion, if only by our silence and inaction.
