
St. Paul the Apostle and Immaculate Conception Churches

FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Proclaiming the Gospel of Life.

This past Thursday I was in Ottawa for the March for Life. At a time when it seems that every week brings us extensive media coverage of another "march for *this*" or a "march for *that*," we might wonder why *this* particular event which annually brings upward of 15,000 people to Parliament Hill, is virtually ignored by the mainstream media. The *Ottawa Citizen* usually gives it a mention on page 5 with, of course, more attention given to the "prochoice" hecklers than to the March itself.

If the purpose of the March for Life is to make a big splash on the evening news, then it can hardly be considered a success. But the importance of the March does not depend on it being a "media event." Nor is there much expectation that it will influence politicians — Justin Trudeau and Kathleen Wynne have been very clear that they have no interest in pro-life votes. Both the federal Liberals and NDP require their candidates to sign on to the full agenda of the culture of death — effectively banning Christians from their parties. This is something that they consider eminently worthy of praise. In their view, Christianity, despite it's fundamental role in the creation of Western Civilization, is now "on the wrong side of history."

So why do we do it? Why do we keep up this persistent resistance to the culture of death?

More to the point, how can we *not* do it? Pope John Paul II said: "Never tire of speaking out in defense of life." In his Encyclical *Evangelium Vitae* (The Gospel of Life), he wrote:

Every threat to human dignity is felt in the church's heart. It affects her faith and engages her mission of proclaiming the *Gospel of Life* — a proclamation especially pressing because of the new threats to the life of individuals and peoples, especially where life is weak and defenseless. New threats are arising at an alarming scale. I repeat the words of the Second Vatican Council condemning crimes and attacks against human life:

"Whatever is opposed to life itself such as any type of murder, genocide, abortion, euthanasia, or willful self-destruction; whatever violates the integrity of the human person such as mutilation, torments inflicted on body or mind, attempts to coerce the will itself; whatever insults human dignity, ... all these things and others of their kind are infamies indeed. They poison human society, but they do more harm to those who practice them than to those who suffer from injury. Moreover they are a supreme dishonor to the Creator." (Second Vatican Council, *Gaudium et Spes*).

The teaching of Pope John Paul II on the Gospel of Life, which is simply the perennial teaching of the Church, is even more essential today than it was twenty years ago. As Christians — as true disciples of Christ — we need to know where we stand. And we need to *publicly* stand for the dignity and value of all human life.
